From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

The Baltimore Catechism asked the question, "Why did God make you?" The answer is, "God made me to know Him and love Him and serve Him in this life, and to be happy with Him forever in the next life." I've heard this interpreted to

mean that eventually we will be happy when we get to heaven, but for now we're only suppose to sacrifice and suffer and serve God - so just forget about being happy.

Well, that doesn't make much sense to me, because if we truly know God and love God and serve God, then we'll be among the most joyful people on earth. Jesus never said our life on earth is destined to be a joyless journey of sadness. We are not supposed to mope around here with sad expressions on our faces while we wait to go to heaven.

In this week's gospel reading Jesus said, referring to His followers, "I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly." Sure, Jesus was talking about eternal life in heaven, but He also was talking about having abundant life here on earth. We are supposed to have joy in this earthly journey, despite the struggles and the pain.

A lot of the suffering and pain here on earth can't be avoided. Illness, accidents, and tragedies happen without warning, bringing grief to people through no fault of their own, but sometimes much of the suffering we experience is our own doing. We can make ourselves miserable by our attitudes and actions. The most debilitating emotions we can have are anger, envy, and revenge. Jesus showed us that one way of dealing with our sufferings is by forgiving others. Remember His words, "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do."

My hope for each of us is that we know more fully that when we forgive those who hurt us, we are not letting them off the hook as much as we are letting OURSELVES off the hook. It's not about them, it's about us. Rather than let anger and bitterness grow inside us like a cancer, we instead become filled with peace. When we avoid the green-eyed monster of envy, when we are satisfied with what we have rather than envious of what others have, life is much more enjoyable.

Small Church Community

Scripture Focus: The image of God as Israel's shepherd was used over and over again in the Hebrew Scriptures. Jesus in John's Gospel uses this image when he describes himself as the Good Shepherd. When sheep were away from the sheepfold, they spent the night within a walled enclosure. The shepherd would lie down in the opening, thus becoming a gate to the enclosure. Moreover, sheep respond only to the voice of their own shepherd. Jesus explains more fully: He is the gate; he alone is the means of access to God. He is the good shepherd who calls followers to himself and leads them to God. He brings his flock not only security but life to the full, even now, in the life of the eternal God.

Life Focus: * When did you give guidance to someone that would lead them to follow the way of Christ? * What are your qualities, strengths and weaknesses that help you or others to follow the Good Shepherd? * In what ways have you responded to God's call during this last week (or month)? * Relate an experience when you heard God's call and followed that call. * Share your experience of God protecting you from false people. How did you hear the Master's voice?

From Deacon Don's Desk:



This past week we have been reading the Acts of the Apostles. A comment was brought to my attention: St. Stephen, a deacon (and first martyr), has his martyrdom celebrated the day after Christmas **and** again in the third week of Easter. A mar-

tyr is a witness. Stephen is shown as a witness of the birth and death of our Lord (the beginning and end of human life).

I offer the following to reflect upon: There are two special moments each and every day, sunrise and sunset. We often take the midday for granted. At sunrise is when the sun appears its largest; it slowly extinguishes the stars. Look at it as it breaks on the horizon. Sometimes it appears twice as large as normal. Then at its setting, the light fades, a coolness sets in. As it retreats, it again appears larger than normal; it seems to pause briefly as it meets the horizon and it shows itself in **completeness**. It then relights the stars. Just as these are special moments in the day, so are birth and death special moments in the life of a human. People seem larger at these moments; we realize they are unique and made in the image of God.

OUR PRAYER: Father God, never let us take our neighbors for granted. Each one is special to You. You made each of us with Your special care **and** in Your image. Never let me underestimate the uniqueness of each person You have created. Amen.

Being able to recognize text messaging "meeting codes" can help parents be more effective monitors of their child's safety. Meeting codes are used by strangers to gain information about people they don't know or to arrange a first meeting. They can be used between friends, but most are more commonly used in other circumstances. For example, "S2R" means "Send to receive (pictures)," and "WYRN" means "What's your real name?"
