In today's Gospel during his final discourse to his disciples at the Last Supper, Jesus tells them of his imminent departure and he knows that they are disturbed. Jesus is about to

leave them, but he knows that his death will result in victory. There is a heavy air of gloom and anxiety, as the enemies of Jesus close in around him.

At this point, he encourages his friends telling them not to be troubled in their hearts. He shares with them about the necessity to trust in God and in him. It is a call to total faith in the Father and in Jesus. He tells them that in his Father's house there are many dwelling places, where he and his faithful followers can be together.

The departure of Jesus is in order that he might prepare a place for us, a place where we will be eternally at home. We are all aware of the comfort, peace and quietness of being together with our families during happy times. Here Jesus gives his disciples, and us, the great assurance that he will be with us after his death and will give new life to us through our baptisms.

My hope and prayer for each of us is that we remember that we too are called to have total faith in Jesus, knowing that a place has been prepared for each one of us in his Father's house.

In January 2011, Dr. Kevin Baxter, Superintendent of Catholic Elementary Schools for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, announced that the elementary schools would be moving to a 200 day school year beginning in August 2011. During these past 4

months, Fr. Jim and I have had numerous conversations regarding this extension. We have listened to parents, outside educators, and our own faculty before coming to the following mutual decision. As was stated at the parent meeting held on February 9, St. Joseph School will remain on the 180 day schedule for the 2011-2012 school year. After that, the school will move slowly to the 200 day school year by adding 5 days a year beginning with the 2012-2013 year. This will continue until 2015-2016 when the school will be at the full, extended school year of 200 days. Realistically we know that this is not a decision that will please everyone, but we feel that it is the best for our students. The expectation of the Archdiocese is that all parish schools implement the 200 day schedule. As part of the Archdiocesan Catholic School system, we feel it is important that St. Joseph Elementary School remains in compliance with the vision of the Department of Catholic Schools and the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. We will, of course, closely monitor the changes and their effects on academics, attaining educational standards, and standardized test scores. We continue to move forward with the vision of making St. Joseph School the best it can be with graduates that are ready and able for high school. Principal Hebestreit

Scripture Focus: Today's Gospel is taken from Jesus' long speech at the Last Supper. When he announces his departure, the disciples are understandably sad, but he consoles them with warm words of hope. Through his death they will go to the Father. The central verse of this Gospel, when Jesus identifies himself as "the way, the truth, and the life," reveals Jesus not only as the "way" to the Father, but as the revelation *of* the Father. In his *humanity*, he reveals what God is like. Jesus' kindness, his compassion, his concern for the poor, his forgiveness of sinners help us to know the Father.

Life Focus: * Relate an experience when you did something for others because they valued and trusted you. * Describe an experience when you had to trust without knowing what would happen. * Tell of an experience that showed a wavering of faith on your part. * Describe a personal experience when you wanted someone to show you the way. * Where is home for you? * Where do you feel like a stranger? Why?



From Deacon Don's Desk:

God loves you, no ifs, ands, or buts!! Nothing can keep us from the love of God: Neither Avalanche, Tsunami, Arthritis, Lumbago, Incessant Euphemism nor "any other created thing will be able to separate you from the love of God." (Rom 8:39)

Feelings are fragile. Dr. Gerald Jampolsky wrote, "Everything we think or say or do reacts like a boomerang. When we send out judgment through criticism, anger, or attack-thoughts, they come back to us." He said, "I suggest you try one day this week to suspend all judgments, spend that day in acceptance and see how this scripture will be fulfilled in your hearing." But if you do run into negativism remember: Moses didn't say "I don't do rivers," Noah didn't say "I don't do arks," Mary Magdalene didn't say "I don't do feet" and Jesus didn't say "I don't do crosses"....God loves you just the way you are, but He wants you to be the best version of yourself.

OUR PRAYER: God, when You created mothers, You put Your heart in theirs. You gave them amazing love: Your love. Grant that their families honor them with the spirit of profound respect. Amen.
