From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

When Pope John Paul II died on the Saturday of Easter Week a few years ago the whole world was keeping vigil at his bedside. He attracted the world's attention by the power of his personality and by all of his travels across the globe. After

twenty-six years and after all his international travels, the Pope was dying and the world came to his doorstep, to be with him.

The final days of John Paul's life were a witness to everything that he stood for, to everything he had preached so fervently through the years. Even his final illness, his weakness, became a sermon on suffering telling the whole world that every life and every stage of life is important and valued. On his last Easter Sunday, he was unable to speak words for an Easter message, so he stood at the window and read it silently, while someone else read the words out loud. Then he gave his final blessing to the city and to the world.

This final act was his personal witness to the truth of the Gospel that he wrote about in his encyclical letter "The Gospel of Life." In that letter John Paul had written, "The just man does not seek to be delivered from old age and its burdens... But, He accepts from God the need to die and he trusts in God."

John Paul did exactly that. And in so doing, he was a witness to the good news about life. What is the good news? Jesus Christ is the king of glory. He has conquered evil. He has conquered death. He has ascended to heaven. And where he has gone, we hope to follow.

This is the story of Jesus Christ. This is our story too.

Did You Know? What's Your Plan in the Event of an

Emergency? Did you know that every Catholic school in the L. A. Archdiocese is required to have a written plan for emergency procedures? The plan must include provisions for fire, earthquake, disaster and evacuation drills and lockdown procedures that conform to local, state and county reguirements. Each school's plan must be updated annually and made available to parents. Does your own family have a similar plan for what to do and where to gather in the event of an emergency? From Deacon Don's Desk:

Remember when it was called Ascension Thursday? Now you are dating yourself! Yeah, OK, I also remember. Some years ago Tina and I taught the pre-Baptism class. After some background introduction we would ask, "Why do we

baptize?" We would get some interesting answers. Tina would then ask me, "Well, Don, why do we baptize?" Turning to the very last paragraph of Matthew's Gospel, I would read that passage. Jesus told us to! "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, til the end of the age."

In the sentence just prior it says, "when they saw Him, they worshiped, but they doubted." What did they doubt? That He was God? No, they 'worshiped Him'; maybe they doubted their own strength to carry out Jesus' mission? We are baptized into His family. We are now challenged to carry out that mission to be anointed as PRIEST (to be holy), PROPHET (to speak out for those who are unjustly criticized or oppressed) and KING (to protect the widow, orphan and marginalized). We begin by teaching and instructing our families by example and reaching out to our neighbor. OUR PRAYER: Lord, You promised the Spirit to Your apostles, to make them Your witnesses to all people. By this same power of the Spirit strengthen our own witness and confirm our faith to do Your will. Amen

When were you happy that you completed some work that you really dreaded to start? * Jesus is the Lord of my life. What difference does this make in the way I live mv life?
