### From the Desk Fr. Jim:

In the parable of the sower, Jesus uses a common sight in Galilee to make his point. He used farmers sowing their seeds in a field by hand, throwing it out of a bag as they walked up and down. The seed was thrown everywhere

knowing that some, hopefully most, would take root. Inevitably, though, some of it was wasted or lost.

Jesus explains that the four kinds of soil represent people who hear God's message to them and they respond in different ways. Jesus' disciples were not to be surprised that some people would reject their message and others would disappoint them after appearing to believe.

But the parable also shows that there would always be some people who would persevere. Not everyone would be like the apostles, dropping everything and becoming pioneer evangelists, but each person's service would be used by God to reap "results".

This encouraging story reassures us that whatever rejection we might face, that our faith and actions will always be far more fruitful than we can imagine or even see at the time. The parable assures each one of us that when we remain faithful to God we will have fruitful lives.

### From Deacon Don's Desk:



In the past, I have written about the Preface, the prelude or opening to the Eucharistic prayer. We find it hard to fully understand the richness of this prayer. At the last Baptism of little Lucca Bella, Fr. Scott was saying the preface and little

Lucca began clapping her hands as we began the Sanctus Sanctus (Holy Holy). She got it!! Joy was all over in that little child!! Oh, that we would be focused as she was that day. Weeks passed and we may have missed the Mass of Corpus Christi, the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord. This feast began in 1247 when an Augustinian nun, Julian of Liege, received visions that God wanted His people to celebrate His institution of the Blessed Sacrament. As a young boy I remember a sweet little nun tell me that each time I miss Mass it is a time that I cannot make up. Why do I say this? Because, as parents we are called to enlighten and instruct our children, especially at the impressionable age that will stick with them. Encourage them. Summertime is not the time to slack off because you are traveling and find it too hard to find a Catholic church on Sunday.

The fundamental action of Jesus' life, the reason why He became one of us, was the gift of Himself in His passion, death and resurrection - the Paschal Event. To simplify: He died for us so we could live forever with Him. It's time to give back, especially by faithfully attending Mass.

At last week's Eucharistic Adoration I was pleased to see about 13 or 14 attended and about 8 stayed for Benediction. Next time (I am asking parents) please bring your children. It's quiet time, what I call "wasting time with the Lord." Come and sit a spell.

Did You Know? Always Keep an Up-to-Date Photo

of Your Child Picture this: A good photo could save a child's life. One of the most important tools for law enforcement in the case of a missing child is an up-to-date (take a new one every six months), good-quality photograph. The photograph should be a recent head-and-shoulders color photograph of the child in which the face is clearly seen. It should be of school-portrait quality, and the background should be plain or solid so it does not distract from the subject. When possible, the photograph should be in a digitized form and available on a compact disk (CD), as opposed to just a hard copy. This minimizes the time necessary to scan, resize, and make color corrections before disseminating it to law enforcement. The photograph should have space for accurate, narrative description useful to identify the child, such as name, nickname, height, weight, sex, age, eye color, identifying marks, glasses, and braces.
