From the Desk Fr. Jim:

Today's readings invite us to ask ourselves an important question: What is the one desire of our life that, once found, will make all our other legitimate desires a reality? The gospel calls this ultimate desire of the human heart "the

kingdom of God" or "the kingdom of heaven."

The kingdom of God is God's reign in our hearts, in our lives, in our homes, in our society, and in our world. The one who finds the kingdom of God finds everything desirable besides. That's why it's compared to hidden treasure in a field that a man finds, then goes and sells all that he has and buys the field, or a precious pearl, which a merchant finds, then goes and sells everything he has and buys this one pearl.

In fact, these parables invite us not only to seek first the kingdom of God but also to seek only the kingdom, because with the kingdom of God comes every other good thing that we desire and long for.

Remember, the kingdom of God is not just one among so many other good and desirable things. It is the "summum bonum," the supreme good, the one and only good thing we shall ever need to achieve total satisfaction and fulfillment in life. If we have the kingdom of God we have everything, and if we don't have the kingdom of God we have nothing.

Adult: Sometimes decisions are a matter of choosing priorities. What kind of lifestyle changes would I need to make to focus more on things of eternal value? Child: What good thing do I want so much that I would give up something else to get it?

Teen: As I begin owning things of my own, what is most valuable to me, and how will I balance that with the value of my faith?

From Deacon Don's Desk:



Many years ago Pope John Paul II visited Lima, Peru. It is estimated that the crowd reached two million people. Rather than the greetings from the cardinal and president, two people from a poor town came forward to the mic. They were Viktor

and Irene Charo. The crowd was quiet as they spoke: "Holy Father, we are hungry, sick, we have no work, our children die before their time. Yet we believe, Holy Father, we believe in the God of life. We hunger for bread." The crowd was quiet. The Pope spoke in Spanish: "You tell me you hunger for bread." "Yes, yes!" the millions replied. "You tell me you hunger for God." Again the crowd yelled, "Yes, yes!" The Pope said, "I want this hunger for God to remain; I want your hunger for bread to be satisfied." He then turned to the generals and wealthy politicians, many devout Catholics, and said, "I won't simply say share what you have. I will say give it back. Give it back! It belongs to the poor."

St. Augustine, on the Eucharist, says that "the Mass was about three things: goodness, unity and charity." He said that if we were not better people, working for unity and loving each other away from the Eucharist, it fails to achieve its purpose.

At every Mass Christ says, "Here I am, broken and poured out in love for you. Take me. I'm here for you." The danger is that we think this gift is for us alone. St. Augustine tries to correct us. May we not just share with the poor from our excess but **give back** the food that is rightly theirs! **Our Prayer:** Lord help me to spend this day for Your Glory and our neighbors' good. Amen.

Scripture Focus: The Gospel today speaks of true wisdom, a priceless treasure to be sought with all one's heart. In the first comparison Jesus uses, a man discovers a treasure that was so valuable that he "sold all he had and bought the field." In the second comparison a pearl merchant discovers a pearl worth more than all his other possessions. Common to both stories is the marvel of discovering such a prize and giving everything to gain possession of it. The point of both parables is that gaining the treasure of God's saving love is worth any sacrifice. Life Focus: * Describe a time when a decision you made seemed right or wise. Name a time when a decision you made seemed to be wrong or unwise. What made the difference in these decisions? * Relate an experience when you were able to uncover a "hidden treasure." What helped you to see its value? * What in your life is most valuable to you? How do you find God present in that value? * What are you willing to "pay" or "give up" in order to possess what is valuable to you? * What about you could be described as being like the "pearl of great price"? What are the gifts that are uncovered by being related to each other as members of the same communitv?


