From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

As the Body of Christ, we're called to recognize our blessedness, allow ourselves to be broken, and share ourselves with others. It sounds so simple. But it's not as easy when we try to put some flesh on it, and attempt to describe it in con-

crete terms. Two of the three seem pretty straightforward. We have some idea of what it means to be blessed. We know that we're blessed and we can see the hand of God at work in our experiences and in us. And the sharing part, well that's pretty straightforward also. We know what it means to be there for others, to help where we can. But the breaking part of discipleship, that's the tough one. What does it mean? How do we do it? What does it look like? I'd like to be able to give you one explanation that works for everyone. But that's not how it works.

No, the "breaking" that needs to happen in us is different for each person. Because what needs to be broken are those things that are impenetrable, solid, rigid, immovable, and resistant to the transformation God wants for each of us. There has to be chinks in our armor in order for God's love, mercy, and power to penetrate us.

What needs to be broken in you and in me? Unloving attitudes? An inability to forgive? Feelings of superiority? Walls of jealousy? An ego out of control? Resentment? A presumption that we're the center of the universe? What keeps us from living generous, other-centered lives? What keeps us from truly being Eucharist to one another? The miracle of the loaves and fishes may have happened a long time ago, but we can share in that miracle in so many ways and circumstances today. So many people need and deserve a break. My hope and prayer for each of us is that we allow God to "break" us, and help us transform the world.

Scripture Focus: Jesus is mourning the death of John the Baptist. But even though he is troubled, Jesus is aware of the needs of those around him. Instead of focusing exclusively on his own needs and concerns, he reaches out to heal others and even to feed a great multitude. This miracle had Eucharistic implications for the early Christians. Moreover, he continues to feed the poor and the hungry through his Church. When the disciples suggested that he send the crowd away to "buy some food for themselves," Jesus tells them, "Give them something to eat yourselves." The Christian community is likewise commanded to feed the hungry in its midst. The Eucharist would be an empty ritual if it didn't motivate people to do what Jesus did.

Life Focus: * Recall a time when you felt mournful, threatened or afraid, but the needs of others took priority. * Recall a time when someone helped you in your time of need. * Name a time when you helped another who was in material or spiritual need. * What are people in your life hungry for? * When have you given to another only to find yourself with more than you've given? * Relate an experience when you received beyond what you ever hoped for.


