## From the Desk of Fr. Jim:


Today we're told in the first reading that God didn't speak to Elijah through great signs of strength and power, but in a soft whisper of the gentle wind, in the midst of the ordinary and the common. We seek miracles, but most of the time

we only find our normal lives. And like Peter in the Gospel, when we find ourselves before the powerful presence of God during our daily struggles, we believe we can't do it. Just like Peter we too can have doubts. We stop thinking about the opportunities to find God in our daily life, which is filled with extraordinary moments of his grace.

"Why did you doubt?" Jesus is asking us, just as he did with Peter. With God we can perform extraordinary things, but the most beautiful thing of all is that we are able to do ordinary things extraordinarily well. Our doubts, our lack of belief, will not lead us toward success. We can continue dreaming about all our aspirations, even walking on water, but our ability to attain them can fail if we don't recognize that our God is always with us, stretching out his hand, and calling us to go with him. Listening to God in the midst of our daily work can seem like something really simple, but in reality it is the most difficult part. It is like walking on water.

Leftovers from last week's homily: The old saying goes: "If you feel distant from God, guess who moved?" In the past few weeks we have heard at least seven parables. Remember: "The seed is in the Gospel." Did you find a seed

or a kernel that resonated with you? We often leave the Church and are distracted by the world around us. We have been fed and somehow forget that reading, "Nothing can separate us from the love of God." We may have focused on the miracle of the loaves and fish (I noticed that Jesus did not 'break' the fish!!), but did we miss the underlying image: the prefiguring of the Eucharist? The action of breaking of bread makes the connection with Eucharist, our Mass. The feeding of the crowd is what it is all about.

Fr Richard says, "Eucharist would be an empty ritual if it did not motivate us to do what Jesus did. The problem is when we look around we see some of us have so much while others have nothing. If this reality does not move us to a change of heart and proper action then we have not understood the story of the loaves and fish, that God's goodness is not intended for a few." Our Baptism calls us to be servants **not** to be served. We are called to proclaim but more important to **practice**.

Some people may say, "How could God allow such poverty?" The question may cause us to be distant or move away from God. The right question to ask is, "**Guess who** has moved away from whom?"

OUR PRAYER: Almighty and ever-loving God, Your Spirit made us Your children, confident to call You Father. Increase Your Spirit within us and bring us to our promised inheritance. Grant to those who have died the glory of resurrection, and give us a share in their happiness. We ask this in Your Son's name. Amen.

**Scripture Focus:** Part of the purpose for this Gospel passage was to encourage the community. This account was written fifty years after the Resurrection event. Matthew's audience is suffering opposition, rejection, even persecution. They are beginning to worry that the risen Lord has abandoned them as well. Here Jesus reassures his followers, telling them not to be afraid. Matthew gives special attention to Peter's attempt to walk on water. Peter often acted impulsively. He came to realize his weakness and his need to rely on the Lord for help. Matthew hopes his listeners will come to the same recognition.

**Life Focus:** \* When has fear overcome trust in your life? \* *Relate an experience when you trusted at first but later began to lose faith.* \* Where do you find courage in your life?
