From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

Sometimes there are people who judge others as inferior or unworthy of their attention. This also happened during the time of Jesus, when women and children and non-Jews weren't properly valued, and they were considered to be

among the lowest echelon of society. Jesus did the unexpected when he encountered the Canaanite woman, and he taught his disciples then, and each one of us today, to expect the unexpected.

Firstly, society of his day said he shouldn't have been speaking to a woman, much less a foreigner. Secondly, there was no expectation from the community that this woman would be capable of having such a deep faith. But she persevered in her conversation with Jesus and demonstrated that faith has no boundaries of race or class. There are times today that people still are victims of prejudice due to a lack of understanding and discrimination.

We need to reject these attempts at minimizing another person. If we are able to act as the Canaanite woman did, with faith and perseverance, then we'll be amazed by the power of our trust and faith in God and truly be on the way to becoming the person that God calls us to be.

Did You Know? Summertime, Safe Time - All teachers, staff and volunteers in the Archdiocese who work with children must undergo fingerprinting and criminal background checks. Archdiocesan guidelines and abuse prevention training programs in use in the Archdiocese emphasize the importance of parents knowing who has access to their children at school and other church-sponsored activities. Summertime is here, and parents should remain vigilant regarding who is granted access to their children. Make sure camp counselors have undergone criminal background checks. And, make sure you know the camp's "daily routine." In particular, make sure that no camp activity results in a child being left alone with one adult. All activities should be supervised by more than one adult, and the camp should be open to unannounced drop-in visits from parents.
