From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

We like it when people tell us what they think about us when their opinion is positive. We're glad when people have a good image of us, because it says a lot about who we are as people and how we live our lives. When Jesus asked his

friends, "Who do people say that I am," Peter expressed his opinion of who Jesus is. He said, "You are the Son of the living God."

When Jesus asked them this question, He wasn't just asking them what other people thought of him, He was also allowing Peter to verbalize his faith for the first time. In addition, He gave Peter and the other disciples the ability to realize a wonderful truth for the first time. That truth was that they came to know who they were, brothers and sisters in Christ.

For Peter to say that Jesus is the Son of God is something like a mirror that reflects an image back at us. And so, the good news of the gospel this week is the truth that if Jesus is the Son of the living God, then as his brothers and sisters, we are also children of God, and therefore we have an enormous dignity that can never be taken away from us.

Catechetical Corner Why is there a need for a new translation?

Pope John Paul II issued the third edition of the *Missale Romanum* (the



Latin text of the *Roman Missal*) during the Jubilee Year in 2000. This new edition included many new texts requiring translation. In addition, the experience of the years after the Second Vatican Council gave rise to a desire for more formal and literal translations of the original Latin texts. This new translation will employ the best of what we have learned about translation and liturgical language in two generations of celebrating the Liturgy in the vernacular. It will provide an opportunity to reflect ever more deeply on the Eucharistic celebration that lies at the heart of the Church's life.

Small Church Community

Scripture Focus: Matthew is the only evangelist to use the term "Church." Church is an earthly experience of the Kingdom of God. Because Jesus is always with us, the Church can never fail. The keys symbolize opening up doors to truth and wisdom. Giving the "keys of the kingdom" means that authority is being given to teach and make decisions for the Church community, although the extent of that authority is not clear. Authority exists only for the sake of the Church community and its work of proclaiming the Kingdom.

When has the Church been an obstacle? * Relate an experience when you were a "rock" of strength for another person. * What qualities do you see in yourself that Jesus saw in Peter? * Describe an experience when responsibility was entrusted to you. * In your experience, what is it like to be entrusted with a set of keys (to a car, a house, an office or a store)? * When did you exercise authority that helped someone open a door to a fuller life?
