The time is quickly approaching when the implementation of the new translation of the Roman Missal takes place. It occurs on the First Sunday of Advent this year, which is on November 27.

The Vatican and our Archdiocese has issued a statement recently that allows those prayers and responses that are usually sung at the Sunday liturgy (the Gloria and the Holy, Holy, Holy) to be used beginning in September. In order to help ourselves familiarize ourselves with the new translation we will start praying these revised prayers beginning with the weekend of September 10-11.

We will have worship aids in the pews with these revised prayers to help us during this transition. During the weekends of September we will recite the Gloria and the Holy, Holy, Holy, in order to become familiar with the words. Then, beginning in October we will begin to learn to sing these prayers.

My hope and prayer for each of us as we enter into this new period of transition in our Liturgy is that our love of God and our sense of gratitude are deepened through our worship and praise.

Catechetical Sunday - Sept. 18 - This year's theme is "Do this in Memory of Me." Special recognition of those who serve our parish community as catechists will take place at the 9:00 a.m. Mass. Please remember our catechists in your prayers as they share their gifts and faith with our children, teens and adults.


Catechetical Corner What's new or different about the revised translation?



The style of the translation of the third edition is different. In accord with the rules for translation

edition is different. In accord with the rules for translation established by the Holy See, the revised translation follows the style of the original Latin texts more closely, including concrete images, repetition, parallelisms, and rhythm. The English used in the Mass texts is more formal and dignified in style. Where possible, the texts follow the language of Scripture and include many poetic images.

In addition, the third edition contains prayers for the celebration of recently canonized saints, additional prefaces for the Eucharistic Prayers, additional Masses and prayers for various needs and intentions, and some updated and revised rubrics (or instructions) for the celebration of the Mass.

He also offers practical guidelines for fulfilling these responsibilities. Serious community decisions are to be made only after serious prayer. Wisdom must be sought from God and from the presence of Christ in their midst.

Life Focus: * Relate a time when you hurt someone and the person confronted you about it. How did you feel and how did you respond? * *Relate a time when your prayers were answered but not as you expected.*
