From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

Today, September 11, we commemorate the 10th anniversary of the terrorist attacks on our country. We remember in our prayers all those who lost their lives on that day in New York, Arlington, Virginia, and the field near Shanks-

ville, Pennsylvania.

We also remember those families and friends that continue to deal with the aftermath of those days' events. And last but certainly not least we remember all those first responders, firefighters, police officers, medical personnel and those private citizens who valiantly helped those who were injured and in need.

In the Gospel reading today, Peter approached Jesus and asked him. "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventyseven times.

It is important to remember, however, that forgiving another does not mean absolving them of responsibility. To forgive someone is to acknowledge that they have done wrong and are in need of forgiveness. Mercy doesn't cancel out justice or the need for conversion, but it does open up a path of charity that encourages and promotes conversion and justice. For the Christian in the world, we live in mercy and we long for justice, but we entrust final justice always to God.

This may be a hard message to hear, but Jesus' words today are challenging us in a big way. When something that is dearest to us has been attacked, how will we respond? The Gospel challenges us to consider what a Christian response might be. My hope and prayer for each of us is that we develop a deeper understanding in our hearts, knowing that our response will have longlasting implications on us as persons and as a society.

When we pray Psalms we deal with our human emotions, glad, sad, mad, scared, anxious, confused, hurt, all our problems with God, Himself. Direct line to God!



Catechetical Corner

What is the timeline for the approval and implementation of the Missal?



After the Latin *Missale Romanum* was published in 2002, ICEL began its work of preparing a draft English translation. ICEL presented the Order of Mass, which contains the fixed prayers of the Mass, including the people's parts to the English-speaking conferences of bishops in 2004. The USCCB approved the final version in 2006, and the Holy See confirmed this section in 2008. The USCCB completed its approval of the *Missal* in 2009. The Holy See granted the final approval of the text in the spring of 2010. Cardinal Francis George, OMI, president of the USWCCB, announced that parishes may begin using the revised translation on November 27, 2011.
