From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

We sometimes experience situations like the one in today's gospel. We might think that we deserve more because we work harder and it turns out we're getting compensated exactly the same as everyone else. It seems unfair.

The master in today's parable seems extravagant in his generosity. We can't understand why God's logic would work in such a manner. I mean after all, fair is fair and you should give everyone what he or she deserves. What exactly is today's parable trying to tell us? Why is God distributing equally to those who arrived early in the morning and those who got there later in the afternoon?

Sometimes people think that since they've been faithful to God their entire lives by going to church, by complying with all the rules, that they'll get a bigger piece of heaven than those who haven't always done the right thing or were distracted and came into the faith much later or asked for forgiveness toward the end of their life.

My hope and prayer for each of us is that we come to know more fully that there can't be less space in the heart of God the Father for those who return to Him. And that there can be no less compassion in God toward those who have not enjoyed his presence and who have not discovered him, until in their final hours. Those who arrived in the first hour are equally precious to God as those who come at the last minute.



Catechetical Corner

Can we start using the texts approved by the bishops immediately?

The translation of the *Missale Romanum* could not be used in the celebration of the Mass until the complete text was confirmed by the Holy See. Now that the translation has received the *recognitio*, the USCCB has established the first day on which the new translation may be used. Use of the revised text requires preparation and catechesis for both priests and the faithful. When the time comes to use the texts in the celebration of the Mass, priests will be properly trained, the faithful will have an understanding and appreciation of what is being prayed, and musical settings for the liturgical texts will be readily available.

From Deacon Don's Desk:

In case you did not read the Tidings of two weeks ago where Archbishop Jose Gomez wrote an article titled "What happens at Mass?", here are a couple of paragraphs that I thought were of importance:

"In every Mass Jesus comes to walk with us and talk with us. He opens scripture for us to challenge us to open our hearts to believe in Him. So, we should approach every Mass with a spirit of reverence and awe! Your experience of the Mass will change if you try to get there a little early so you have time to settle your mind and prepare your heart. Enter the sanctuary slowly and reverently without speaking. Talk to Jesus."

When this deacon is early he tries to say the following prayer: Here I am, oh good and gentle Jesus, kneeling before You, with great fervor and desire. I ask You to instill in me lively sentiments of Faith, Hope and Love. With true repentance for my sins and a firm resolve to amend my ways, I hear the words which David spoke in prophesy of You: 'They have pierced my hands and feet and I can count all my bones.'" (Ps 22:17) This prayer may help to center you and enter into the Mass that the priest offers "in persona Christi."

The Archbishop goes on to say, "The priest will pray a more precise greeting, 'The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the **communion** of the Holy Spirit be with you all.' One word changes, "communion' instead of 'fellowship' which we are used to hearing. ...the people will respond 'And with your spirit.' These words are from St Paul--it reminds us that we are more than material bodies. What a beautiful gift, the gift of the Spirit which we were given at Baptism. We join ourselves to Christ's great act of love on the cross. We ask our Blessed Mother to help us better live the Mass."

By the way, did you remember Sept 8, the feast of the Nativity of the Virgin Mary?

OUR PRAYER: Lord Jesus, help us to have recourse to Your holy Mother Mary. Grant that she may obtain from You the grace for us to serve You and to be faithful to the church all of our lives. Let us encounter You in the sacraments on earth and so possess eternal life. Amen.


