From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

In the parable found in today's Gospel, the king who sends out invitations to his son's wedding is God and the king's son is Jesus himself. Those who are sent out to invite the guests represent the prophets and apostles, who often faced death or

abuse. This parable of the wedding feast was intended by Jesus to persuade his audience and us to be ready to accept his teaching on the kingdom of heaven and not to delay. Those who decline to attend the wedding feast, or make excuses, or abuse the king's servants are those who hear the gospel but reject it and are actually hostile to it. God invites everyone, sinners and pagans to the wedding feast instead of those who were first invited and rejected the invitation.

Because we are human, each one of us has the potential to decline God's invitation to believe the gospel and put it into practice. All that waits for those who reject the message outright is a self-inflicted unhappiness, which is not the will of Jesus, who offers salvation to all.

My hope for each of us is that we accept the invitation to the wedding feast because eternal happiness is the gift given to each of us who believe and accept the Good News and act on it.

Catechetical Corner


If my parish likes the old translation better, can we continue using that



one? Now that the Holy See has granted

the *recognitio* to the revised translation, the USCCB has established a date for first use and a date for mandatory use. No parish may continue to use the current translation after the mandatory use date. Parishes will need to use the period before the mandatory use date to help parishioners renew their love for the Sacred Liturgy, to understand the changes, and to develop an appreciation for the revised translation.

From Deacon Don's desk:

I remember when the "revised" Roman Missal came out in the 1970's. The emphasis was on "full active and conscious participation." One priest told the following: While processing into Mass I said to

myself, not knowing the microphone was on, "This mic is not working!" and the congregation responded, "and also with you!" Fr. Gerard Weber, (1918-2009) wrote a book titled "The Eucharist, a View from the Pew". In it he said, "We are so familiar with the words of the Creed that we frequently rattle it off without much feeling or thought. In fact sometimes it seems the people are having a race to see who finishes first. I want to call out, "Slow down! Think of what you are saying!" Paraphrasing him, "We recite a statement that's not only a list of truths we accept but also it's a song of love. We are listing God's qualities. It's expressing our total trust in the God of whom we speak. The words should flow back into our hearts to strengthen our love."

In my deacon formation years I recall Fr. Frank Ferrante helping me form my **core beliefs**. They are as follows: 1. Acknowledge God. 2. God revealed and continues to reveal Himself. 3. We acknowledge God loves us. 4. He expresses His deep love for us by sacrificing His only Son to give us life that will not end.

We come to Mass to try and understand and experience the love He shows us.

OUR PRAYER: Father God, You helped St. Francis to reflect the image of Christ through a life of poverty and humility. Help us follow Your Son by walking in the footsteps of Francis of Assisi and imitating his joyful love. Help us to see You in all people. Amen.
