### From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

In the Gospel today, Jesus asks, whose face is on the Roman coin? Obviously, it is the face of the country's leader, Caesar. Therefore, the coin belongs to this world and it belongs to Caesar. The original question by the Pharisees was

asked in order to entrap Jesus. If he said the tax should be paid, then he would be in agreement with something illegal in the Jewish religion such as bowing down to a pagan authority, but if he said no, they could accuse him of being rebellious. So he responded with the utmost truth: "Give Caesar what belongs to Caesar."

But how do we determine what belongs to God? It's easy. Who do we look like? Some of us might say that we look like our father or mother, or other relatives. If we dig deeper, we might say that we have a personality similar to someone in the family. But when Jesus asks this question, there is only one answer. We look like God because we are all created in the image of God. Like the coin, if we look like God, if his image is engraved in us, then it means we belong to God. Belonging to God means we were created to love.

We are in God's image when we have patience with our children; when we are capable of forgiving others; and when we are of service to others. Give to each his own. To Caesar we give the coin, which is really worth very little, and to God we give nothing less than our entire being.

### **Catechetical Corner**

## Do these changes mean that the old translation was not valid and ortho-



dox? The current translation was ap-

proved by the conferences of bishops and confirmed by the Holy See. Until the new text becomes effective, the current translation remains the valid ordinary form of the Liturgy in the Roman Rite. The revised translation attempts to address some inadequacies in the present translation by introducing a more elevated style of language and by retaining many poetic texts and scriptural allusions. The current translation fostered the faith of two generations of Catholics and retains a valid place in church history.

### **Small Church Community**

Scripture Focus: Matthew makes it very clear that two opposing political groups have united to trap Jesus: If he supported paying taxes to Rome, he would be accused of being a traitor to his "own" people. If he refused such payment, he would be charged with acting against the government. Jesus is not fooled. He turns the situation back at them. It is clear that they have accepted Roman rule because they can produce a Roman coin. It belongs to Caesar; it has his image and inscription on it. So Jesus says if it belongs to him give it to him, but "give to God what is God's." He is telling them that there is a Kingdom higher than that of Caesar. All people are made in the image of God. They belong to God, and Jesus calls them to give their lives to God, not to earthly concerns. Life Focus: \* Relate an experience when you felt pressured into making a decision contrary to your principles. \* Describe an experience of being caught in a no-win situation with family, at work, or in society. \* What belongs only to God in your life?


### PARISH HEALTH FAIR AND BLOOD DRIVE
