From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

Today's gospel parable focuses on Jesus' apparent delay. Why is he so long in coming back when people suffer so much and the world is in such a mess? Neither this parable nor any other teaching answers that question, but it does re-

assure us that he hasn't jilted his people. He hasn't gone back on his promise. We can be sure that He will come. one day, but we can never know in advance when that will

In the meantime, he calls on us to watch and to wait, with "oil in our lamps," in other words, always ready for service, always ready to welcome him. We're all called to be servants who are always ready to do what our God asks of us.

St. Joseph School participates in a wonderful art program entitled "Meet the Masters." Each year the students study six or seven of the great masters of art and then produce their own piece of art based on the master's style, medium or time period. This year's masters

are Norman Rockwell, Andy Warhol, Henri Rousseau, Edward Hopper, Maria Martinez, Gustav Klimt and Michelangelo. Some of the artists are older masters and some are more contemporary. Students are introduced to each master with a slide presentation and discussion led by Sonya Stone, an artist from the Meet the Masters program. After school, the faculty and parent helpers create their own art project for that master and are given step-by-step instructions on how to coach the children in producing their own piece. When I was still in the classroom teaching, I always enjoyed producing my "piece of art" because I had always been convinced that I couldn't even draw a straight line! I must admit I thought my projects turned out pretty well for such a non-artist as me. You can imagine how enthused the students are when they produce pieces that they never thought they were capable of doing. Whenever you have a chance on the weekend after Mass, stop by the art display in the hallway and check out which master we have been studying lately!


