### From the Desk of Fr. Jim:


In the Gospel today, it seems like Jesus has become a financial advisor, which is a very popular profession these days. And maybe it isn't bad advice for those of us who don't know how to manage what we have and end up in difficulty because

we didn't learn to save or manage our finances better. But, on the other hand, this message appears to contradict the warnings and advice that Jesus makes in other places about money.

Is he contradicting himself? No. But today is a day to take stock in what we have. What we have received in personal qualities, such as blessings, relationships, gifts, and even material wealth. We should give thanks for our talents.

What purpose would the talent of all the geniuses in history have served if they had not created anything? The nature of God, which is given in great abundance, is to relate, to multiply, to give to others and produce fruit in our lives.

In reality, the things we have do not belong to us: they were given so we could continue God's great works in this world. To selfishly hide them will only end up killing them. When we give generously of our talents, only then can they produce greater kindness, and love will make them multiply. I leave each of us one question to reflect on. What talents or qualities have you received that need to be shared with others?


### Knightly News

### From Deacon Don's desk:

Leftovers from 31st Sunday: "Do not lay heavy burdens hard to carry on others." Looking more into the reading, we see that Jesus understands human nature. It's easy to lay burdens on others. I cannot demand that others be kind and caring, if I am not. You cannot claim to be a Christian if you are nasty to other people. We cannot demand that others be good Catholics if

we destroy another's reputation by phone, texting or gossip. Actually it may be that we are intolerant of ourselves so we hide from ourselves by focusing our frustrations on others. A priest called this "transference": we can learn from Alcoholics Anonymous. Recovering alcoholics don't go casting stones at everyone else. They recognize they have a problem and with God's help they will try to overcome it. He closed by saying, "We need to stop transference of our inability to accept ourselves upon others! We need to allow the presence of the Lord to refine our lives so we can be happy with whom we are."

St. Leo the Great said, "If we love our neighbor, we automatically love God as well. For it is in the unity of this twofold love that God has constituted the fullness of the Law and the Prophets."

**Our Prayer:** Loving Father, help us to realize that love is the most powerful force in the world. Let us love You and our neighbor because of You.
