• Waiting can be boring. Sometimes we spend so much time waiting for something that we forget what it was we were waiting for. On the other hand, familiarity with something can become too much of a routine. When we repeat the same ac-

tions or words all the time it can become a comfortable routine, but little by little our actions and words can lose their meaning.

As we face this challenge today of keeping meaning in our lives and in our relationships, the gospel tells us we are to remain vigilant and to be on the alert. Maybe we can continue to do the same things in our lives, but by being alert we do them with joy and with more care and love, recognizing in a more profound way those people in our lives.

Today we begin Advent, which is the period in which we wait for the arrival of Jesus in our lives. If we wait routinely, it is possible we will not recognize him. How can we be vigilant? By being alert to the people in our surroundings, listening to our spouses and children; putting care into our jobs; treating everyone with kindness and showing respect for the people that come into our lives. In doing this, when Jesus arrives we will be ready to meet him.

From Deacon Don's desk:

Advent is here! So is the New Roman Missal! We also begin a new Liturgical cycle. During Advent there will be a lot of readings from the Hebrew Scripture (Old Testament) and the reason is to learn

what to hope for. The Jews were hoping to bring together those who were scattered to a land of milk and honey. As our Order of Prayer says, "We differ from the Jews in that the coming of Jesus in history is a partial fulfillment of God's promises which strengthens our hope. Also, we differ because Jesus has revealed to us that God is not far off but already in our midst." Every Sunday after the Lord's Prayer we hear words of an Advent prayer, "We wait in joyful hope for the coming of Our Savior, Jesus Christ." Our waiting in joyful hope for the coming of Christ cannot be passive or an uninvolved time. Like expectant parents we need to be constantly working to make sure everything is ready for the coming of the Lord. The Gospel should move us away from a passive waiting to an attitude of active and watchful waiting. Jesus tells us we must be occupied with the work of the Master.

Our Prayer: Heavenly Father, grant that Your Holy Spirit may inspire us to be a true follower of Your Son, Jesus. May He come and dwell in us always and keep us ever on the path of holiness. Amen.
