#### From Deacon Don's desk:

"Prepare the way of the Lord!!" Zachariah's canticle of St. John says, "You my child, shall be called the prophet of the Most High; for you will go before the Lord to prepare His way. To give His peo-

ple knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins." Lk 1:78

Forgiveness is mandatory; it is not an option when one asks for it. Now is the time! **Reconciliation service at St. Joseph Church will be Tuesday, December 13, at 7:00 p.m.** Can't make that? Then Our Lady of Refuge's service will be Wednesday, December 14, 7:30 p.m. (also OLR at 10 a.m. that same day for those not able to drive at night). St. Cornelius' service is December 22, 7:00 p.m. So we have no excuse not to prepare His way.

In case you may have missed it, December 8 was the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It was also the Patronal Feast day for the United States and the Philippines. This feast was celebrated as early as the 5th century in Syria then the rest of the East in the 7th century. Pope Pius IX defined the Immaculate Conception as a Roman Catholic dogma in 1854.

Mary encourages us to wait, to be patient and make space within ourselves. Then we may hear the Holy Spirit giving the Father's plan for us.

**OUR PRAYER**: Blessed Mother, help us to clear away all that separates us from your Son's birth into our hearts and lives. Pray for us that we may celebrate this Christmas with true joy. Amen.

PS: December is the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe (Patroness of the Americas). Fr, Dyer, SJ put it this way, "We are tempted to think riches, power and popularity are forces behind the world's history. We are tempted to think these lead to happiness. But the Blessed Mother is a contradiction to this mistaken belief. Her love and prayers have repeatedly changed the world's history. Appearing to St. Juan Diego as a mestiza girl, the Blessed Virgin helped bring peace and cultural unity. All this without tanks, armies or money. Just the force of love and prayer." We are challenged to pray for peace in the world and peace in our hearts.

#### **Small Church Community**

Scripture Focus: In this Gospel, John the Baptist saw his role clearly. At the time John was writing his Gospel, followers of John the Baptist were claiming that he, not Jesus, was the Messiah. So here the Gospel writer emphasizes that John the Baptist saw himself as one to prepare the way for the Messiah. He is not the Messiah nor any of the others they suggest. He is just "a voice in the desert" preparing the way for the Lord. His baptism is a simple water rite, unlike Jesus' baptism in the Holy Spirit. John the Baptist proclaims the Good News of Jesus' coming and prepares people's hearts for that event.

**Life Focus:** \* How do you answer the question, "Who are you?" \* *What potholes do you find on your path to Jesus?* \* Who is your prophet? How did this prophet affect your life? \* *Who has helped you to have faith?*

**Did You Know? Shopping mall safety tips** - It's easy for kids to get sidetracked with all the sights, sounds, and smells surrounding us at holiday time. It is especially important to monitor your children when taking them through the mall during the Christmas season. If children become separated from you, teach them to look for a "safe stranger" who can help them. For example, a mom with kids or the cash register person can help a child who is lost. Avoid telling children to go to the "manager." Any adult in a suit, who looks important, can look like the manager to a child. Children must be told never to leave the mall or store to go looking for you in the parking lot.
