From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

For many years in the English-speaking world the feast of Epiphany has been overshadowed by that of Christmas. But unless we realize the significance of this great day, we see only one side of the mystery of the Incarnation.

There are different aspects to the feast of the Epiphany. The first is divine manifestation; Christ has come as the Son of God.

A second important idea in Epiphany is the extension of Christ's kingship to the whole world. Christ being revealed to the three kings at Bethlehem is a symbol of His revelation to the whole of the Gentile world. Epiphany presents to us the calling of not merely a chosen few, but all nations to Christianity.

A third idea that is closely linked to both these themes of divine manifestation and kingship is that of light. During Advent, the world was in darkness, and we prayed and waited in expectation of the Coming Light of the Messiah. At Christmas the Light shone forth, but dimly, it was seen only by a few around the crib: Mary and Joseph and the shepherds.

Much food for thought and reflection is contained in just these three ideas. Epiphany lifts our eyes from the family celebrations and asks that we include in our vision "all the ends of the earth." It asks that, like the three wise men, we have the courage to follow the light of the star we have seen in our own lives, and to be able to see and recognize our Lord Jesus in any unexpected way that He may present Himself to us.



Scripture Focus: Epiphany means "manifestation," a revelation of Jesus as truly God. Matthew and Luke show this child to be divine through stories of "signs and wonders" when Jesus was an infant. Matthew's account of the visit of the three magi also shows the Church's mission to the Gentiles. Matthew's audience, largely Jewish Christians, was struggling to accept the presence of Gentile Christians in their community. Matthew shows in this Gospel passage that the salvation of Gentiles as well as Jews was indeed God's plan.

Life Focus: * What helps you stay focused on God's presence in everyday situations where God is usually not mentioned? * When have you come to appreciate people you used to pass by or not notice? * Who and what on your journey has helped you to know and understand Jesus and his message better? * How do we reconcile the material gifts we have in our lives with the simple life-style of Jesus? * Herod feared losing his power. When have you known people to lie or hurt others because of fear? * Who or what event was the star that led you to a better understanding of Jesus? * What gifts do you bring to the Christ Child? * In your faith journey, when have you taken a different route than you expected?

JUST IMAGINE.....Theme of the 123rd annual

Rose Parade. "One has the feeling that many consider God as foreign to their interests. Apparently they don't need Him. They live as though He did not exist and worse, as though He were an 'obstacle' to remove to fulfill themselves. Even among believers, some let themselves be attracted by enticing dreams and distracted by misleading doctrines suggesting deceptive shortcuts to happiness. Yet despite its contradictions, worries and tragedies, and maybe because of them, humanity seeks a path of renewal, of salvation, it seeks a Savior and sometimes unconsciously the coming of the Savior, the one true Redeemer of man." ...Pope Benedict XVI 12-20-2006

JUST IMAGINE.....The Magi did not travel to the King of Kings to get something out of it. They sought to pay Him homage and bring gifts. When we seek to get something when we give, we are disappointed. When we look to give, we often receive more than we give or expect. It's the same within the Church, if we look to get something, there won't be much there. If we focus our concern with giving of ourselves at Mass, then the Lord will shower us with His gifts.
