From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

At some time during our life, we have all endured feelings of exclusion. Exclusion hurts because it can make us feel less of a person or unimportant, as if our dignity was taken away. Humans are relational beings and we place great emphasis and value on family and friends and neighbors.

Exclusion is a denial of our basic equality and the dignity that we have as children of God. It is to deny our own identity, our being and therefore is also a grave offense against God.

We can sometimes exclude without even noticing it. We exclude people who do not seem to have a voice or anything to contribute on a certain issue or those whose very presence may make us feel uncomfortable because of their personality or way of speaking. Sometimes we exclude people out of a fear that they may embarrass us in front of others. The gospel is a gospel of inclusion. We are all called to share in God's kingdom.

May we come to realize more fully that today's gospel is not only a gospel of physical healing, but also a gospel of inclusion, spiritual restoration and dignity.

Do You Want to Completely Change the Way You Understand and Experience Lent? If you find this invitation intriguing and welcome because you have always understood Lent more from a "doom and gloom" perspective, please join us in the church on Saturday, **February 25**, from 9 am until Noon, for a potentially life-changing few hours.

What is Lent Really About? I believe it's about "Letting Go and Letting God" more in our often frantic and frazzled lives! This morning of reflection will give you the chance to step back from your life and re-evaluate your life in light of God's love and care for us. Scripture Focus: According to Jewish law, lepers were considered unclean and outcasts from society. Yet in today's Gospel, Jesus immediately responds to a leper's request for healing. Jesus had great respect for the Law of Moses, so he told the leper to fulfill the cleansing requirements by offering sacrifice and appearing before the priest. Jesus orders him to tell no one who had cured him, but the leper ignores Jesus' command and tells everyone what happened. In spite of the growing difficulties of his ministry, Jesus continues healing and preaching. He was able to proceed because people had faith in him.

Life Focus: * Jesus reaches out to these outcasts. What groups do you have the most difficulty accepting? * *Relate a time when you were moved with compassion toward someone who was considered "unclean."* * Describe a time when you recognized and accepted another person's ability to help you. * *Tell of a time when you were or were not able to keep good news to yourself.*

Pro Life Corner - Cardinal Joseph Bernardin articulated a consistent ethic of life, which included opposition to both abortion and the death penalty, in 1985. Ten years later, in his encyclical *The Gospel of Life*, Pope John Paul II taught that opposing capital punishment should be part of a pro-life witness for a culture of life that promotes human dignity and solidarity. The National Conference of Catholic Bishops as well as individual bishops across the country have repeated the teaching. - America Magazine

From Deacon Don's desk:

Fr Rohlheiser spoke about "heroes." They appear in classical mythology, Scripture, novels and movies. The common thread is the star enters into suffering, the threat in differing forms of isolation and opposition then (s)he emerges triumphant above all. "The hero's journey is meant to transform adolescence into adulthood, to transform one into an **elder** (person of influence or teaching function) and not by conquering aliens or winning an Academy Award or a Super Bowl."

"A true hero's journey is one that transforms us from an unhealthy pride and egocentricity to healthy humility and will always lead us to the paschal journey where we, like Jesus, drink of the chalice of humiliation but without growing bitter or losing hope. A true hero(ine) often looks more like the humble, gentle, soft-spoken grandmother or grandfather, where each wrinkle tells a story of work, worry, grief, tears, patience and triumph rather than one who is triumphantly hoisting a sports trophy or Academy award."

Parents, this is for you to be aware: "We need to realize how deeply we are swayed by these images of adolescence rather than of mature humanity."
