What a week! Six educators were on campus for our WCEA/WASC accreditation visit from Tuesday through Thursday last week. These six individuals are all educators from the Archdiocese of Los Angeles – four are principals of Catholic schools and two are teachers.

They worked very hard from early morning until early evening each day. During these days they met with Fr. Jim, observed the teaching and learning going on in the classrooms, viewed student interaction on the playground and interviewed the Student Council as well as representatives from each grade level. They also met after school with teachers, staff, PTO Board members and various parents to receive their input and perspective of the school. The end result was a written Report of Findings which they presented to Fr. Jim, the Faculty and me. After that, the team wrote a recommendation for accreditation (a private document that the school does not view) to the WCEA/WASC commissioners. What we do know at this time is that we have a GREAT school and the team was very impressed. Our accreditation should come through some time in June. I'll let you know when it does. Fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday for all who are 18 to 59 years. One full meatless meal, two others to maintain strength but together should not equal a full meal. Liquids may be taken between meals. If health or ability to work are affected, fasting does not oblige.

"And with your **spirit**." The more I dwell on this response the meaning becomes more clear. The "also with you" is like a pencil with an eraser at both ends - no point! It misses the point - **spirit**. The "**spirit**" re-

sponse we give is intended to recognize the priest's station at Mass. By his ordination he is changed through the "laying on of hands" and configured so as to allow Christ to act in him. Scripture Focus: On the surface this seems to be the story of an ordinary healing miracle by Jesus. But beneath the physical cure is the extraordinary act of forgiveness of sins. Only God can forgive sin. Jesus, having the spirit of God upon him and being the Holy One of God, is able to forgive sin. His cure of the man's lameness dramatizes the greater cure of the soul. Through this action Jesus declares that "...the Son of Man has the authority to forgive sins." It would have been easy merely to say, "your sins are forgiven"; the physical cure gave public evidence of Jesus' power over the forces of evil.
