### From Deacon Don's desk:

Love and caring continues to flow from the parishioners of St. Joseph. There were a little over 400 signatures gathered this past weekend for the Parental Consent petition. It is now in God's hands to give the voice to the people and parents to determine the fate of their minor daughters and those yet to be born.

This week's Acts of the Apostles reflected on the "proto martyr" Stephen (first deacon martyr). "The Sanhedrin looked intently at him and saw his face like the face of an angel." He was steadfast in his confidence, courage and discipleship. Last week it took Jesus to show his incredulous disciples his hands and feet and say, "Touch Me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have." for them to believe.

An Ignatian Reflection quote, "The life of faith can be challenging for us who lack the "historical presence" of Jesus, speaking to us in the same way He addressed His first century disciples. We can learn something important from His response to the eager first-hand disciples: Jesus is not looking for credulous followers seeking immediate rewards. He asks for followers who are committed to Him, not to the vanishing fruits of His miracles. St. Stephen did not work for food that perishes, but faith that will endure when the cost of discipleship is reckoned."

OUR PRAYER: God of goodness, help us to appreciate the great gift the Mass is. Help us to make the Eucharist the summit toward which all our activities are directed and the well-spring from which all our strength flows. Amen

Scripture Focus: During Easter season, we look at how Jesus' Resurrection continues to affect people's lives. In the first reading from Acts, Peter heals a cripple in the manner and power of Jesus. In John's Gospel Jesus describes himself as a good shepherd. He knows his sheep by name; he knows their habits and traits. His sheep know him. His love for them is so great that he freely lays down his life for them. People who know each other in the deep way described in this passage share their thoughts, feelings and will. They become one heart and one mind. Each has no life without the other. Jesus and his Father know each other in that way. Now Jesus tells his followers that they too have a share in this depth and intimacy. Life Focus: \* Describe a fearful or hurting situation when someone was there for you. \* Have you allowed the people in your life to come to know you, as Jesus knows his sheep? What gets in the way? \* Reflect on a time when God may have been trying to get a message to you.

In keeping track of your child's text messaging, with its dizzying array of coded abbreviations and symbols, there are some codes that every parent should keep his/her eyes open for. These are codes that kids use to warn others that their parents are around or that they use to talk about sex, drugs, or to arrange a meeting.
