#### From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

Today we celebrate the feast of the Most Holy Trinity, a mystery that defies explanation. Sometimes it is hard for us to understand what goes on inside another person, what they might be thinking or what they might be feeling. At

other times, especially when we love another person we would like to be almost inside the other person's heart and mind, and feel united with them as if we were one.

The same thing happens to us in relation to God. It is not easy to speak about God. It is not easy to speak about something even more remote and mysterious than the people that we have close to us whom we see and touch everyday.

We speak of God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Are these three different ways of looking at the same reality? No, there is much more to it than that. The truth is that there are no real ways of describing God. All we can do is talk about a way of being: God is a mystery of love, a mystery of relationship.

My prayer for each of us is that when we experience the presence of God in our lives, may we feel called to participate in that love and to share it with those around us.


