From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

Today we celebrate the Birth of St. John the Baptist. It is such an important feast day that it replaces the ordinary Sunday readings. It is also important in the sense that his feast day is one of only three whose birthdays we commemorate. The other two of course are Jesus and the Virgin Mary.

The most striking thing we should bear in mind about John the Baptist is that he is the premier evangelizer, the first to announce the presence of Jesus Christ in our world. He is the model for us all in pointing out the tremendously good news that God is present among us.

Could there be any better news than that? Is there any good news that is greater than that good news? Christianity brings us that news. No other faith holds that God became one of us.

The Latin word for good news is *evangelium*. It is derived from a Greek word that is translated as "gospel" or "glad tidings." In recent years our Church has urged us to be a part of the "New Evangelization," to be active in sharing God's good news with folks around us.

So allow me today to challenge all of us. Invite someone you know to come back to church. Evangelization can focus on the conversion of the nations, or on the conversion of those who are not Christians, but it can also focus much more narrowly on the welcoming of inactive Catholics. Everyone here knows someone - a friend, a co-worker, a family member, perhaps even a godson or goddaughter - who has stopped attending Mass or receiving the sacraments.

Send that person a note, or give him or her a phone call, or sit down for a good conversation and urge him or her to come back home to church. If all these suggestions aren't possible, then always keep them in prayer, knowing that God keeps them always in His love.

So try being John the Baptist this week. He began evangelization and now it is up to us to continue with the "New Evangelization."

Did You Know? Summertime, Safe Time - All teachers, staff and volunteers in the Archdiocese who work with children must undergo fingerprinting and criminal background checks. Archdiocesan guidelines and abuse prevention training programs currently in use in the Archdiocese emphasize the importance of parents knowing who has access to their children at school and other church-sponsored activities. Summertime is here, and parents should remain vigilant regarding who is granted access to their children. Make sure camp counselors have undergone criminal background checks, and make sure you know the camp's "daily routine." In particular, make sure that no camp activity results in a child being left alone with one adult. All activities should be supervised by more than one adult, and the camp should be open to unannounced drop-in visits from parents. 
