From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

I always travel with more things than I need. I take clothing, personal items, papers, and books that I think I will be able to read. It's hard to travel light, because we always think of all the things we might need when we're away from

home.

When we travel, there's also a certain anxiety, a certain fear of the unknown. It is as if we don't trust that our needs will be met by the people who will receive and welcome us. In order to have that kind of trust, most of the time we need to have had an experience that those people haven't failed us in the past.

And with that prior knowledge then we more easily trust that, once again, they will do their best for us. Jesus sends his friends out in twos, because it is always better to work as a team and to lean on one another, but he tells them to travel light.

In today's readings we are encouraged to have that kind of trust in God who has given us nothing less than his own son. God, who has called us his children, won't abandon us precisely because we are carrying out his mission.

In fact, at the end of the story we are told that the disciples worked marvelous deeds. They did so because they had trusted the word that Jesus had given them. May we also trust in his word, knowing that He will never fail us.

Scripture Focus: The Twelve are sent to towns of Galilee. It is a trial mission that looks ahead to the Christian mission to the world. All Christians are to speak for God, even when the world does not care to listen. Jesus shares with the Twelve his powers over evil. Jesus says to get moving on this mission right away. The Twelve are to travel light. If they are offered hospitality, they should accept it. If not, they are to shake the dust from their feet, which is what pious Jews did when they returned from unholy territory. Jesus did not tell the Twelve to preach about God's reign. That task belonged to Jesus. They were to be much like John the Baptizer preparing for Jesus' mission.

Life Focus: * Describe a time when you were genuinely lacking resources, but the task got done in spite of your poverty. * Share a time when you were able to let go of the disappointment of your failures and get on with your life. * How did you feel when called away on an emergency and you had to leave without any of the usual necessities? * Relate a time when your attitude shifted from "No way, I can't do it" to "I certainly can." What caused the shift?

From Deacon Don's desk:



"Proclaim the Gospel by your life." At Mass we are sent with these words. In other words, be a prophet like Amos in the first reading. He was only a "dresser of trees." He was called to prophesy to the people of Israel. We too are called to pro-

claim the Truth at work, school, home and neighborhood. Too often we are influenced by polls. We take these "samplings" as gospel. Many Catholics do not believe in the presence of the Lord in the Eucharist! Even in our own families we may hear: "Some things have changed that were immoral in the past but are not today, like living together before marriage, taking harmful drugs, not bringing the children to Mass on a regular basis. We don't want others telling us what to do." We are part-timing our devotion to God.

A priest, Fr. Pellegrino once said, "We must stand for the truth of the Lord, popular or not, convenient or not. We've received the mandate to **proclaim the Gospel by our lives**."


