Scripture Focus: Both the first reading and the Gospel today tell stories of God feeding hungry people through the words and works of prophets. For the next five Sundays we will hear the Bread of Life teaching from John's Gospel. For John, all of Jesus' acts are "signs" - sacraments - that point to a deeper reality. It is clear that the people do not appreciate the deeper meaning of the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves. The reaction of the crowd showed that they thought wrongly that Jesus was the triumphant and political Messiah. So Jesus goes "back to the mountains alone." The people had indeed misread the sign. **Life Focus:** * Relate a time when you were so engrossed in something important that you forgot to eat. * Describe a time when you were surprised that your limited resources were sufficient. * Relate a time when your prayers were answered on God's terms rather than your own.
