From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

In Egypt, the Israelites had been enslaved, exploited and oppressed. When they have the opportunity to gain their freedom, of course they take advantage of it, but they quickly begin to miss the food they received in Egypt.

But God gives them bread from heaven "Manna," a bread that far surpasses the bread they had in slavery, and this bread, in spite of being a blessing is still material and perishable. It is bread that cannot be saved from one day to the next. It nourishes the body, but does not give true life.

The bread of Christ in the Eucharist however, is very different. It is bread that feeds us forever, because by being the Body and Blood of Christ, it offers us a different and everlasting life; the life of the saved, the freed; the life of the children of God.

Scripture Focus: Jesus had just fed the Israelites of his day with "bread from heaven," but they saw only the "bread." They followed him back across the lake to Capernaum. They were hoping for more free food. Jesus uses their question to try to teach them the deeper meaning of the "bread from heaven." He reproaches them for being so concerned about food. They have missed the meaning of the feeding. They do not see this as a "sign" pointing to a deeper reality. When they ask what they must do to perform works pleasing to God, Jesus says, in effect, "nothing." They are asked simply to accept him as the one God has sent. This faith is a free gift of God. The mention of faith makes them impatient. They want action. The crowd is operating on the material level. They are hoping for an endless supply of food. Jesus startles them by saying he is bread which gives life. They must believe in him. He will satisfy them forever. **Life Focus:** * In a society that offers instant gratification and the pursuit of comfort and convenience, what can you do to keep your focus on Jesus? * Where have you seen Jesus this past week? What message did he have for you, and how did you respond? * How has your attitude toward material things changed over your lifetime? Name an experience that shows this change.

From Deacon Don's desk:

Most of the world is now caught up with the Olympics. It's exact origin is not known but most place it about 776 B.C. Even then it was expected that competitors and families, spectators, trainers and the judges take a solemn oath to keep the com-

petition clean and fair, and give just decisions. All conflicts among cities and states were postponed. In 1894 Baron de Coubertin revived the Olympic games. He sought, "Every four years countries would get together on friendly fields of amateur sport, unmindful of national rivalries, jealousies and differences of all kinds including eliminating considerations for politics, race, religion, wealth and social status."

It was in L. A. in 1932 that the Olympic Village was established, and is where the seeds of friendship are sown. Different countries and competitors live and share their stories in one village, making friends.



VPIN (Volunteer and Personnel Information Network) is an Archdiocesan background information tracking system which tracks employees and volunteers regarding their assignment histories, compliance for fingerprinting, background checks, and mandatory VIRTUS sexual abuse prevention training and allows parishes and schools to adapt features of the system to fit their local needs and it assists the archdiocese to complete its audit reports.
