From Deacon Don's desk:

You have heard: "The **grace** and peace of Our Lord Jesus Christ be with you." "But for the **grace** of God, go I." "Hail Mary full of **grace**." etc. So, what is **grace**?

Our deacon formation group developed our own "dictionary" and we defined **grace** as "that free gift of love from God which causes us to love."

The dictionary has it as a verb, to do honor or credit by one's presence. As a noun, simple elegance or refinement of movement. Finally it states: a state of sanctification enjoyed through divine favor.

But I wanted more. The Catechism of the Catholic Church under "Grace and Justification" states: Justification is the most excellent work of God's love. A freely given act of God that takes away our sins and makes us just and holy in our whole being. Brought about by means of the grace of the Holy Spirit and merited by the Passion of Jesus Christ and given to us in Baptism. That grace is a **free** gift that God gives to make us part of the trinitarian life by the act of His love. It's supernatural because it depends entirely on God's free initiative and surpasses the abilities of the intellect and powers of us humans. There are other kinds of **grace**, i.e. actual graces and sacramental graces (proper to each Sacrament) and special graces or charisms (gifts for the common good of the Church including ecclesial ministries).

Suffice it to say: "Grace is that free give of love from God that causes us to love."

OUR PRAYER: Father God, You created us to glorify You through our deeds. Let us be fellow workers with You. May that work benefit our brothers and sisters that with them we may build an earthly city pleasing to You. Keep us faithful to Your law in thought, word and deed. Bring us to that kingdom where You live and reign with Your Son and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Scripture Focus: John's Gospel has no direct account of the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper. Rather, it includes this sermon on the Bread of Life that we have been hearing for the past several weeks. The statement of the opening verse, "the *bread* that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world," is very close to the account in Luke's Gospel of Jesus blessing bread at the Last Supper and saying, "This is my body given for you." Accepting the teaching of Jesus, the Liturgy of the Word, important as this is, only prepares us to share his body and blood. Participation in the Eucharist brings present possession of "eternal life" and is thus a pledge of eventual resurrection.

Life Focus: * Jesus puts great emphasis on the "flesh and blood" reality of the food we now call the Eucharist. Name other ways you "feed on" the "flesh and blood" reality of Jesus. * *What have you done with this "life" received in the Eucharist?* * Describe an experience when you have been the "bread of life" for others.
