#### From the Desk of Fr. Jim:

In geometry class we learned that the shortest distance between two points is a straight line. If that's the case, why are roads often filled with curves? They'd be more efficient if they planned them straight. So why do they build

them with curves?

We all know the answer to the question has to do with the many obstacles the engineers have to deal with when building a new road. Sometimes the best road, although not the fastest, is the one that will take us to our destination safe and sound. The road that we are called to take is Christ's. It's a road that isn't always the easiest to travel on. To follow Jesus requires us to have strength and commitment.

That's why it is not surprising that some of Jesus' early followers decided later on to abandon him and return to their previous, less challenging and more comfortable lives. To live a life according to the teachings and example of Jesus requires us to take the risks of not always being understood, of being subject to ridicule, of not having all that we wish, and sometimes not being considered important people. And it also complicates our lives by inviting us to give to others our precious time and resources,

The risks and challenges of walking in the footsteps of Jesus can be tiresome and might even tempt us to abandon the road and go on our own way. But we are not alone in the journey. We have the support of each other. We also count on God's love, which is present in the love of others.

As I was thumbing through John's Chapter 6, I realized that I was using a pocket-size "Good News New Testament" Bible that was given to me by St Joseph's first deacon, Lou Morrison. One of his ministries was to hand out these handy Good

News bibles. He gave me no less than 10 of these. I did hand some of them out but kept a couple. Lou's wife, Toni Morrison, passed away recently. I ask you to keep the family in your prayers.

We are still in John's Chapter 6. Jesus said, "if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood you will not have life in yourselves" (verse 53), and again Jesus says, "I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on Me will have life because of Me." (verse 57). In the movie, E.T., one scene has the young boy leaving candy for E.T., and in another one E.T. is starved and raids the refrigerator! The message for us: without food we die, whether human or extraterrestrial. This holds true for our bodily life as well as our **spiritual life**. Question: How appreciative are we of the Eucharist as our **spiritual** food?

#### **Small Church Community**

Scripture Focus: Faced with Jesus' claim to be the real bread from heaven, the truth, the revelation of the Father, his disciples had to make a decision. Today's Gospel gives their reaction to that claim. Many reject his words and refuse to believe that he "came down" from heaven. Jesus told them to "stop murmuring" and pointed out the need for that faith which only God can give. The Twelve remain with Jesus. They were the ones who would "remain with Jesus" once he ascended to the Father. Peter sums up their faith, accepting the revelation of Jesus, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." The people who deserted him wanted answers they could understand. Their faith was weak. The apostles did not understand either, but because they loved Jesus, they believed and accepted without understanding. We, too, cannot really understand how Jesus is present in the Eucharist. We cannot know, intellectually, how bread and wine become his "body and blood." When we make our act of faith, however we become one with him in a special, life-giving way.

Life Focus: \* Describe how your experience of the Eucharist has changed over the course of your life and how this had affected you. \* Describe a struggle you had which led to a deeper faith. \* Relate an experience that has shaken your faith. \* Describe an experience when you have taken a risk without fully understanding the outcome. What effect did it have on your life?

This means that an estimated 40 million adult survivors of child sexual abuse are living in the United States today. An estimated 9.6 percent of all school children will be molested by an educator or an employee of a school between kindergarten and 12th grade. Between 13 and 34 percent of all females will be victims of sexual assault before the age of 18, and 7 to 16 percent of all males will also be victimized before they are 18. For particular help, you
