From the Pastor's desk:

When someone falls in love with another person, they don't wait for the other person to tell them how to love them. Doing things for those we love comes from our heart and even goes beyond what is considered to be our normal

duty, to help, to support and to show kindness to others. Today's readings say something similar. Deciding to follow God's law isn't so much an obligation, but it's a commitment that we freely enter. Our words are important because they can heal, they can show love or they can cause hurt. So we need to be very careful of the things we say that can hurt others, or help them or guide them along the right path. But we're not only careful because of what effect it may have on others, but also because what we say is a huge indication of what is truly in our hearts.

A healthy, strong and loving heart produces kind, comforting words that heal. A good heart provides support and often invites us to do good things in facing life's challenges. But we also need to know that a bitter and resentful heart, where there is envy, jealousy, and negativity, produces gossip, hurtful words, and sarcasm. This doesn't bring us closer to God nor do these kinds of sentiments come from Him. In this kind of heart, we don't leave much room for God.



From Deacon Don's desk:

The feast day of St. Monica, mother of St Augustine, was Aug. 27. An Ignatian reflection on St. Monica shows the depth of a mother's love, "St. Monica knew the pain of dealing with her son (let alone with her husband)."

Who hasn't felt deep anguish about our loved ones' choices in life? Who doesn't feel like offering a little re-directive 'help' before hanging up the phone? Though concerns for their spiritual welfare have good intentions, wringing our hands and offering **unsolicited** advice rarely has the desired effect. It tends to drive one farther away, or worse, we succeed in 'guilting' our loved one into compliance. Catholics love phrases like, "I only say this because I love you....." This is guilt-inducing, conditional love to someone not quite ready for the gift of faith. Remember last Sunday's Gospel, "Woe to you scribes and Pharisees, you hypocrites." At the end of the day it was nothing Monica said or proposed to Augustine that brought his conversion. She loved him and prayed for him. God labored on Augustine on God's own time, not on her own time. It's good to remember this when we wring our hands over the faith lives of loved ones who stray. Let the grace today be to love unconditionally, and pray for those who stray. God calls others to Him in His own good ways and in His own good time."

OUR PRAYER: Heavenly Father, grant us the gift of Your love, so whatever we do may be done out of that love. Teach us to love in deed and in truth. We ask this through Your Son Jesus Christ, through the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever. Amen

Scripture Focus: Jesus' words are strong about getting caught up in what one does on the outside. Religion cannot be all externals. Jesus takes the offensive here. He adapts a quote from Isaiah about paying lip service to God with no heart. He warns them about insisting that human rules are God's will. In fact, the Book of Deuteronomy clearly says that nothing may be added or taken away from God's law. Deuteronomy speaks of God's law as a way to show gratitude for God's great love. God chose and formed people freely. These laws of God are not a heavy burden nor a way to win God's love; they are simply a way to respond with love to God's goodness. The Pharisees took God's law seriously and followed it with devotion. But a few Pharisees forgot the heart of religion - God's relationship with people - and got trapped in mere regulations. This passage can speak to our own lives in the Church today.

Life Focus: * Describe a time when your heart led you to do something good, but the "law" stood in the way.

* Name an experience when "the way we (your Church, society, your small church community, your personal life) do things" got in the way of what's really important.

* Relate a time when you judged a person unacceptable because of externals.

This means that an estimated 40 million adult survivors of child sexual abuse are living in the United States today. An estimated 9.6 percent of all school children will be molested by an educator or an employee of a school between kindergarten and 12th grade. Between 13 and 34 percent of all females will be victims of sexual assault before the age of 18, and 7 to 16 percent of all males will also be victimized before they are 18.
