Our faith is full of symbols. For Christians today incense has ritual and symbolic meaning. It's sweet aroma symbolizes something pleasing and acceptable being offered to God. It is also a sign of reverence and dedication such as incensing the body at a funeral Mass. The body was once the temple of God. In a more solemn liturgy, incensing the Book of the Gospels reverences the word of God and Christ Himself who is the Word Incarnate. Incensing the altar shows respect for Christ whom the altar represents and His sacrifice made present upon the altar. Incensing the Easter candle is also showing reverence for Christ who is the light of the world. Incensing the Blessed Sacrament at Benediction is a sign of adoration and worship given to Christ, truly present upon the altar. It becomes a sign of our prayers rising up to


