From the Pastor's desk:

In the Gospel this weekend, for the second time. Jesus announces to his disciples that he has to suffer and be put to death. Jesus announced this same thing in last week's gospel and Peter wouldn't hear of it. Jesus says it again in today's

gospel and once more the disciples fail to understand. They declared their faith in Jesus as the Messiah, and they committed to be his followers, but they don't realize the full meaning of what it means to be a true follower.

Jesus isn't speaking here about the kind of suffering that one might have because of a sickness or because of some natural disaster like a flood or an earthquake. Any person, Christian or non-Christian can have that kind of suffering in their life. Jesus is talking here about the kind of suffering that we will specifically have because we are a Christian and attempt to live a truly Christian life.

We will suffer because to be a Christian isn't a matter of privilege but a matter of service for others. This is the hard, demanding reality of the Christian life. It was extremely difficult for the apostles, and it is just as difficult for us as well.

My hope and prayer for each of us is that learning from the mistakes of the apostles, we are not afraid to question, we are not afraid to inquire more deeply and we are not afraid to face straight on what Jesus is telling us, and that we come to know more fully that we may suffer simply because we are his followers.

There is a video by Fr. Kempf we used in our prebaptism classes. I like his saying, "Children's pray-

ers are very powerful with God." School is now in full swing. It's time for us as parents and grandparents to be reminded of that. And it means we need to pray as a family which includes our children. We are the best teachers of our children. Encourage them to pray. When we think about it we can understand that their prayers are more sincere than our own. Do you need a little **boost** for your "petition to God"? Ask your children to help **you** pray for that intention. God always answers our prayers. His answers may come in one of three ways, A: Yes or, B: Wait or, C: "I have a better plan." God's reality is different than our own.

We owe it our children to bring them up in the faith. We need leaders to bring our faith to all. It begins in the home and family. Our faith and ministry does not end when we receive Confirmation. Not unlike other professions that require "continuing education," it's an on-going process. We hear words like "catechesis" or "mystagogia." It boils down to instruction or continuing education. "Liturgy" first meant a "public work" or "service in the name of or on behalf of the people." In our Christian tradition it means the participation of the people of God in "the work of God." Through the liturgy Christ, our redeemer and High Priest, continues the work of our redemption in, with and through His Church. That's you and me! Instead, they do the exact opposite of Jesus' teaching: They struggle with each other for position and power. Jesus answers with a symbolic action that is stronger than words. He embraces a child, a symbol of powerlessness. He directs them not to build up a power structure but to embrace powerlessness. In the same way, the power of the Christian community will be in powerlessness.

Life Focus: * Describe an experience when you gained insight from an experience of being defenseless and powerless. * Why is it difficult for you to be last of all? Why is it worth it? * Tell of a time when your life was enriched by a person who gave up power willingly.

* Relate a situation when you were tempted to try to control another's life or situation.
