From the Pastor's desk:

We learn in the Gospel today that Bartimaeus knew what he wanted. He aggressively pursued the attention of Jesus. He asked for what he wanted. Jesus responded with a miracle. Bartimaeus responded by following Jesus. In

listening to today's gospel I think that we are taught to ask Jesus for what we need.

For a host of reasons we sometimes stop praying or we pray less frequently. Sometimes if we do pray, we neglect to ask for anything for ourselves. What stops us from praying and asking for what we want? Fear, anger, guilt, broken hearts, temptation, apathy.

Maybe we do not think that we deserve to be happy. Maybe we are angry with God for what appears to be unanswered prayers. Maybe we are tempted away from prayer by worldly or sinful things. Maybe we stop caring about our relationship with Jesus.

If this is what we're doing, then now is the time to put a stop to that. Now is the time to call out to Jesus right here and now, loud and clear just like Bartimaeus, to once again think about what we need and is missing in our lives. If we can do this then I am very sure that we will hear the voice of Jesus ask us — What do you want me to do for you? And, then we need to answer.

Bartimaeus said that he wanted to see. What is it that we want to see in our lives? When you know what that is, ask for it. And then, have faith.

Stewardship Corner

Dear Parishioners, five separate families expressed some concerns to me during the past week regarding their financial contributions to the parish. Their concerns all centered around questions they have regarding the Archdiocesan assessment that all parishes pay. They told me that they hesitate to give to the parish because they do not want their donations to go to the Archdiocese to pay for the settlement that was reached regarding the sexual abuse cases.

I want to let each of you know that the money that our parish and all parishes are assessed goes to the following: The assessment is used to pay our portion of liability insurance; it also includes monies for the priest and parish staff retirement fund, health insurance etc. A portion of the Archdiocesan assessment also goes to general operating expenses that the archdiocese has such as staff salaries, insurance and various archdiocesan ministries like the Office for Worship and the Marriage Tribunal. None of the money that parishes are assessed has been utilized to pay for the sex abuse scandal.

The monies used to pay for the settlement came from different sources. The first source was paid through the insurance that the archdiocese carries; another source was from the sale of diocesan properties including the high-rise office building on Wilshire Blvd. that serves as the Chancery office for the Archdiocese. Another source was through the sale of more than half of the 100-acre property of St. John's Seminary in Camarillo.

The monies that we as a parish are assessed by the archdiocese goes toward paying our share of expenses that the diocese incurs which benefit our parish, as well as supporting the diocesan staff that are necessary to administratively run the Archdiocese.

It is also very important to know that if you still have concerns about giving any of your offerings to the Archdiocese, you can designate any and all of your weekly offering as <u>restricted</u>. You can restrict your weekly offering to different ministries like music, youth ministry, religious education or the building fund. When you restrict your offering in this way, you can be assured that your restricted offering will remain in the parish and be used for what you designate. I hope that this gives some reassurance and options to parishioners that have concerns about the archdiocesan assessment that each parish is required to make. If you have any questions about this issue or any other concern please feel free to call me at the rectory.
