

## From the Pastor's desk:

In the Gospel reading this week, John the Baptist reminds the people, especially the Pharisees and Sadducees, that there has to be a connection between their rituals and their convictions. The baptism that John proclaims is

an opportunity to reestablish the harmony between our words and our actions.

Being a Christian isn't magical. We aren't simply baptized as an infant or an adult and then not required to do anything else. Baptism may be a unique and one time event in our lives but it has everlasting consequences for our whole life.

We don't work for the advancement of our own kingdom or agenda. But we are called to help prepare the kingdom of God. We are not the main act, but we are the supporting group. We are not Messiahs, but by the way we live our lives, we can truly make straight the highway of the Lord.

Many followers left John the Baptist and followed Jesus. My hope and prayer for each of us here is that we also are able to lead others to follow Jesus, the Lord.

## **An Advent Prayer**

Lord, I love you. I am so grateful that you came to us as a baby so long ago, and I can't wait for you to come again as Lord. But right now, I ask you to come into my heart and fill me with your love. Come, and let my family



know your presence. Come, and pour out blessings on your church. Come, and give us all a deeper yearning for you. Come, Lord, and be our Prince of Peace!

Farmers hope for lots of rain right after they plant their corn. Once it sprouts and gets a good start then they hope for a "dry period." The reason is to force the corn's roots to grow downward in search

of water, rather than stay on the surface. Unless the tap root of the corn grows downward to the "water level" the corn will wither and dry when the heat of summer sets in, it will have no way to draw water up. Our prayer life is like that. God usually gives us a good start. Then God lets a "dry period" set in to force our prayer roots to grow downward to the **faith** level, rather than stay on the surface at the **feeling** level.

**Year of Faith** - This Year opens the door of faith by inviting us to renew our friendship with Christ and rediscover the Church's teachings, and Advent opens the door of a new liturgical year. With these spiritual "doors" opening, consider what the physical

doors in our lives look like: our parish church, our home or apartment, even my room. What do people see, outside, before the door opens? Do branches, flowers, a seasonal wreath - adorned perhaps with ribbons or fabric in appropriate (liturgical?) colors - offer a wordless welcome that heralds a warm personal greeting? Christmas decorations, outdoors and inside, are already customary. Why not plan something similar for Advent, Lent, Easter, even Ordinary Time? Situate the family crèche in an honored setting just inside the door, so it can be the first thing that visitors see. Replace it during Lent with a treasured crucifix, then a Resurrection icon or Christ candle, an image of Our Lady during May, and so forth.

Did You Know? Tips for choosing safe toys for kids -

Millions of toys are out there, and hundreds of new ones hit the stores each year. Toys are supposed to be fun and are an important part of any child's development. But each year, scores of kids are treated in hospital emergency departments for toy-related injuries. Here are some general guidelines to keep in mind when toy-shopping: Toys made of fabric should be labeled as flame resistant or flame retardant. Stuffed toys should be washable. Painted toys should be covered with lead-free paint. Art materials should say nontoxic. Crayons and paints should say ASTM D-4236 on the package, which means that they've been evaluated by the American Society for Testing and Materials.
