# WE HAVE COME TO WORSHIP THE KING

## The Epiphany of the Lord January 6, 2013

St. Joseph Parish is a community of believers who uphold the teachings of the Gospel and the traditions of the Roman Catholic Church, foster the formation and enrichment of parishioners in spirituality, worship and education, providing a welcoming environment to all. We live Christian lives by praying together, caring for our diverse community, encouraging and sharing of ourselves in service to others.

## From the Pastor's desk:

St. Matthew's Gospel this Sunday was written for a primarily Jewish audience. The fact that Jesus had come as the saviour of the whole world, and not just for one race and culture would have been a difficult truth to believe. It

was an issue that sharply divided the early Church.


We don't know exactly where the wise men came from. They are called magi or astrologers, and were probably priests of another religion from in or around Persia, what is now Iran.

They were astrologers who believed that they could foretell events by looking at the movements of the stars and this was a practice that was banned in the Old Testament scriptures. Yet they were the first non-Jews that recognized Jesus for who he was. They even brought gifts that appropriately symbolized his future ministry:

They brought gold, for the one who would be acclaimed King of kings and Lord of lords. They brought frankincense, the sign of a priest offering up the prayers of the people for whom Christ eternally intercedes. And lastly they brought myrrh, a spice used for embalming, which is a vivid reminder that his mission would be accomplished through his life-giving death.

Through the story of the magi, what Matthew seems to be saying is that God intended all races and all cultures to seek and to find Jesus. It wasn't easy for Matthew's readers to accept the fresh vision of the Gospel, the vision of being open to all peoples equally.

My hope and prayer for each of us is that we may grow in our ability to love one another as Christ loves us, setting aside those surface differences, and accepting everyone that we meet as our equals in Christ.



We know that time is a prized commodity; we don't want to "waste time." I propose that we do honor the Creator of time. Take time to just **be**. Let God do the talking. Even if it is for only one minute. A few minutes after Mass is a time to sit still.

God took the initiative by the birth of His only begotten Son; that tells us how much He loves us. God doesn't send us "presents" but becomes present to us.

The ball is in our court now. We need to reflect that love. As the moon reflects the sun's rays, so we too need to reflect the Son's love for all.

Did you know that January 5 is the feast day of St. John Neuman, the promoter of parochial schools who authored two German catechisms and was our first American Bishop to be canonized? Many studies show that there are over two million enrolled in Catholic schools, and that it saves the U.S. taxpayers about 20 billion (yes with a B) dollars, based on an average of \$8,700 per student in public schools...this is from a 2009 report. It may be higher now.

A Blessing for Homes at Epiphany: We pray at the manger scene: Lord God of heaven and earth, You revealed Your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this home and all who inhabit it. Bless us with health, goodness of heart, and gentleness. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect Your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen OUR PRAYER: Lord Jesus, help us to be alert and on guard for Your second coming. Let us be prepared every day to come to meet You in eternity. Amen

**Year of Faith -** The joy of love, the answer to the drama of suffering and pain, the power to forgive offenses, life's victory over death's emptiness: all this finds fulfillment in the mystery of Christ's incarnation, in Jesus becoming human and sharing our hu-

man weakness in order to transform it by the power of his resurrection (see Benedict XVI, Door of Faith, 13).

This Year of Faith has opened wide the "door of faith." The liturgical "door" that opens every calendar year is the solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. Her Son is the Prince of Peace, thus her feast fittingly coincides with the World Day of Prayer for Peace, whose theme this year is "Blessed are the peacemakers." Peace, writes the pope, grows from deep within each human soul as God's gift. It flowers whenever we work to build peace in the world, as individuals and as members of the human family. As January unfolds, the Sunday Gospels proclaim Jesus' "manifestations" as Savior of the world: on Epiphany, to the Gentile nations, in the persons of the magi; on the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, to the people of Israel listening to John the Baptist at the Jordan; at Cana's wedding feast, to the smaller circle of disciples, as Jesus changes water into wine; finally, in his hometown synagogue, as Jesus inaugurates his public ministry by proclaiming his mission of bringing glad tidings to the poor, liberty to captives, sight to the blind, freedom to the oppressed.

Are You Prepared for 2013 Tax Law Changes? The current estate tax laws will expire at the end of 2012. Unless Congress intervenes before that time, you will see significant changes. Here is a preview:

Gift and Estate tax exemptions drop dramatically: The gift and estate tax exemption decreases from \$5.12 million to \$1 million in 2013. This exemption is the amount you can pass to your beneficiaries without being taxed. The gift and estate tax rate applied to amounts transferred in excess of the \$1M exemption will increase from 35% to 55%. The annual gift tax exclusion - the amount you can give to anyone gift tax-free each year - is projected to be at \$14,000 (\$28,000 for married couples).

Capital gains and income taxes increase: Capital gains taxes will increase from 15 to 20 percent and the top income tax rate will be raised from 35 percent in 2012 to 39.6 percent in 2013.

Portability ends: For 2012, if one spouse died without using up his or her federal estate tax exemption, the unused portion could be transferred to the surviving spouse. This is called a portability provision. In 2013, however, portability between spouses ends.
