#### From the Pastor's desk:

Today's gospel about the temptation of Jesus tries to share with us how to avoid tragedy in our lives and helps us to understand clearly how Jesus' temptation in the desert has meaning for us today in our lives. The story tells us as concretely as possible how real and deep the struggle was within Jesus.

He was challenged to make a decision about how he would live his life and do the work that he felt God had sent him to do. He was tempted to seek out ways that were beyond the uncertainties and limitations that belong to ordinary human beings like us. He overcame this temptation. He chose to accept fully his humanity, to accept the way that God would show him how to proceed as a man actually living and being within this world.

The gospel story is telling us that, like Jesus, we also have to overcome temptation and realize that the only way of salvation that God gives us is to live and work within our human condition and with all of its limitations. If we understand this, then we will be able to appreciate that the temptation of Jesus wasn't something strange and extraordinary that only had to do with Jesus but that it also has real meaning for us.

Fast and Abstinence - Abstinence from meat on all Fridays of Lent. Fasting on Good Friday for all who are 18 to 59 years. One full meatless meal, two others to maintain strength but together should not equal a full meal. Liquids may be taken between meals. If health or ability to work are affected, fasting does not oblige.

#### Stations of the Cross and Soup Nights

Fridays of Lent, soup will be served in the hall 5-7 p.m. (There will not be soup Feb. 22 due to Religious Ed Congress.) Stations of the Cross will begin at 7 p.m. in the church.



Year of Faith - Today the world has special need of people whose minds and hearts have been enlightened by the word of the Lord and who can offer a credible witness that opens the hearts and minds of many others to desire God and true life, life with-

out end (see Benedict XVI, Door of Faith, 15).

The Lenten journey of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving leads the catechumens to the life-giving waters of baptism and the rest of us to the renewal of our baptismal vows. Indeed, Jesus calls Peter to "catch" others so they can have life in all its fullness. Luke doesn't say "fish" for people, as Matthew and Mark do, but "catch," using a special Greek word that means "catch alive," that is, rescue from the wild for a new and better life. We who have been "caught alive" to enjoy "life in all its fullness" are sent to rescue our brothers and sisters, fellow sinners, from danger and lead them to fullness of life with Jesus.

#### From Deacon Don's desk:



If you reflect on last week's three readings, there is a connection, namely "callings." In our baptisms we're **called** to be "Priest, Prophet and King." It's not only a calling for Isaiah, St. Paul or St. Peter, it is addressed to you and me. We are to be that

Christ that people need. We need to pray for our seminarians seeking that day of ordination. Pray for more vocations. Let's not wait for Vocation Sunday, to pray for that "calling." Begin now, during Lent. It's a time for strengthening our prayer life. Remember "R.E.P.'s" that is **Reflect**, Eucharist and Prayer. Do it like "repetitions" until it becomes a habit. Lent is not just about self denial but establishing a **relationship** with our God.

May I suggest two prayers as you approach to receive the Body and Blood of Christ: "Let not the partaking of Thy Body and Blood, oh Lord Jesus Christ, which I though unworthy presume to receive, turn to my judgment and condemnation, but through Your goodness may it become a safe -guard and an effective remedy of body and soul. Amen." "What has passed our lips as food, Oh Lord may we possess in purity of heart. That which is given to us in time be our healing for all eternity. Amen."

OUR PRAYER: Heavenly Father, show us how to love those we are tempted to judge. Show us how to follow in Your Son's footsteps in our Lenten journey and throughout our lives. Strengthen our trust in Your love for us. Graciously hear our prayer. Amen
