St. Joseph Parish is a community of believers who uphold the teachings of the Gospel and the traditions of the Roman Catholic Church, foster the formation and enrichment of parishioners in spirituality, worship and education, providing a welcoming environment to all. We live Christian lives by praying together, caring for our diverse community, encouraging and sharing of ourselves in service to others.

From the Pastor's desk:

There are some voices that we recognize immediately. There are voices of people that we really love or there can be voices of people we don't really care for. There are times when we don't want to hear those voices. Sometimes the

voices don't ask us for anything. They simply greet us or inform us of something. Many times the voices that we hear call us to action: they ask us for a favor, or they want us to pay a debt, or they encourage us in one way or another to do something.

Jesus tells us in the Gospel today that those who follow him recognize his voice among many other voices, and in recognizing it they know what to do. Sometimes we can pretend that we are deaf. If we don't hear what someone asks us then we don't have to do anything. But, if we claim that we are followers of Jesus, then we need to recognize his voice and we need to do something.

Where do we hear the voice of Jesus today? We hear it in the people close to us, those people who have our best interest at heart. These are the people who have the voice of Jesus in our lives today. Sometimes we might hear it in a message at Church. Sometimes we hear it in something that is happening in our lives, which causes us to reflect on the meaning of life and what we value most. It is in all these things that we hear or be can be the voice of Jesus in our lives today.



Year of Faith - April encompasses Easter's Fifty Days, during which Resurrection joy should overflow the hearts of believers to refresh a parched and weary world with the revivifying waters of faith, hope, and charity. All month, at every Mass, we read

Luke's Acts of the Apostles, charting the young church's Spirit-led journey, sometimes peaceful, sometimes persecuted, beset by enemies without and turmoil within. But this young church is always moving onward, from Jerusalem's familiarity to the strangeness of every place between there and Rome; and outward, from an inherited Judaism's comfortable uniformity to the Gentile world's challenging diversity. A week after Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday invites us to renew our personal relationship with Jesus, a principal element of this Year of Faith. On the Third Sunday of Easter, Peter's net is not torn, despite its one hundred fifty-three fish (one of every kind!), an image of the Church's unity-indiversity safeguarded by communion with Peter. On Good Shepherd Sunday, the church prays for priestly and religious vocations. All the while, Acts shows people drawn to the early Church because they had seen the Risen Jesus not in person, but in persons, in disciples who still form Christ's living Body, the Church.
