From the Pastor's desk:

In today's Gospel, the religious leaders in the crowd are outraged that Jesus accepts the affection of a sinner because they feel that they are superior to her in God's eyes. They don't seem very familiar with the God that they claim

to serve. If we see others as greater sinners than ourselves, then we'll end up believing that we deserve God's love and appreciation more than others.

This isn't a very healthy attitude in the kingdom of God. Jesus tends to have harsh words for those who look down on others. While all of us are special in God's eyes, none of us is more special than anyone else. We all need the infinite, and unconditional love of God. God's mercy isn't dished out reluctantly, or measured carefully, as if there isn't enough for all of us.

We don't have a God who is consistently counting our sins. Todav's Gospel shows us that what God counts as important is how often and how sincerely we worship him and love others, rather than how strongly and frequently we condemn others or ourselves.

Let's always remember that the love of God is big enough to forgive all of our mistakes and failures, especially when we come to God with sincerity, honesty and gratitude.

What is RCIA? Every year thousands of adults choose to join the 1.2 billion Catholics in the world today. They embark on a journey of conversion through RCIA, the Rite of Christian Initiations of Adults. Started in 1972 by Pope Paul VI, the process has four stages, beginning with a period of Inquiry. This step is the personal reflection of one's own life and their journey into a life of Catholic Christian Faith. The Catechumenate phase, for those who elect to proceed, concentrates on the spiritual formation of the individual. It allows them to explore the Catholic Church and decide how they can grow as part of the Catholic community. The Election phase, which begins on the first Sunday of Lent, prepares individuals to receive the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion) at the Easter Vigil. The final stage, Mystagogy, continues until the Feast of Pentecost, and leads the neophytes (new Catholics) into a deeper understanding of the sacred mysteries of the Catholic liturgy. The RCIA process leads not only to a change of status with respect to the Church, but also a change of status with respect to God. For those who embark on this journey it is truly life-changing.
