

#### From the Pastor's desk:

Some of the Jews of Jesus' time understood "neighbor" in a very limited sense. For them, your neighbor is the one who shares the same religious persuasion as yourself. The average Jew would not regard the Samaritan as a

neighbor. Samaritans are outsiders. The circle of neighborly love doesn't include them.

Jesus came into a world of "we" and "them," "we" being the circle of those recognized as neighbors, and "them" being the rest of the world regarded as hostile strangers and enemies of the people.

The new thing in Jesus' teaching of neighborly love is his insistence that all humanity is one big neighborhood. He breaks down the walls of division and the borders of prejudice and suspicion that humans put up between "us" and "them."

To bring home this point he tells the story of the Good Samaritan. This man is regarded as Enemy Number One by the Jewish establishment simply because he is Samaritan. Yet this Samaritan is the one who finally proves himself to be neighbor to the Jewish man in need. So to the question of "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus' answer is: anyone and everyone without exception.

## Together In Mission - We are getting there!



Persevere in asking, seeking, knocking at the door, the door opened wide in this Year of Faith to bestow our heavenly Father's first and best gift, the Holy Spirit.

with these: A. What's yours is mine. B. What's mine is mine. C. What's mine is yours. At one time or another we recognize ourselves in each one of these situations (not at the same time). In the gospel two questions are posed to Jesus by a legal expert, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus asks, "What is written in the law?" After reciting the passage he asks Jesus, "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus answers with a story, then asks in response, "Which of the three was neighbor to the victim?" Of course he answers, "The one who treated him with mercy." We are called to visit A. and B. and C. above. Where do we fit? Who do we find it easy to pass by? Why? Were you a "good neighbor to a stranger?" Why?

Love is not fulfilling oneself through the use of another. Love is giving oneself to another, for the good of the other and receiving the other as a gift. Blessed Pope John Paul II PAPAL INTENTIONS (July):

#### LIVING GOD'S COMMANDS

The first reading forms part of Moses' farewell discourse, a call to the people to return to God. It is not a legalistic summons; rather, it is an appeal to heart and soul. It outlines a command that is not impossible to follow, or too difficult to undertake, or too expensive. Look into your hearts, says Moses; there you will find what to do.

Paul sees Jesus Christ as the image of God, the agent of creation and preservation. We sense, in his words, things profound: "dominions or principalities or powers." But in the midst of that, Paul keeps his attention on Jesus Christ, head of the church. It is in Christ that we find fullness and reconciliation—in the blood of the cross.

Luke's Gospel illustrates the double commandment of love with the story of the Good Samaritan. The story is a radical one, for it comes to focus on the question of who my "neighbor" is. That neighbor is not identified with any group, but rather by the scope of our compassion.

What is RCIA? Every year thousands of adults choose to join the 1.2 billion Catholics in the world today. They embark on a journey of conversion through RCIA, the Rite of Christian Initiations of Adults. Started in 1972 by Pope Paul VI, the process has four stages, beginning with a period of Inquiry. This step is the personal reflection of one's own life and their journey into a life of Catholic Christian Faith. The Catechumenate phase, for those who elect to proceed, concentrates on the spiritual formation of the individual. It allows them to explore the Catholic Church and decide how they can grow as part of the Catholic community. The Election phase, which begins on the first Sunday of Lent, prepares individuals to receive the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion) at the Easter Vigil. The final stage, Mystagogy, continues until the Feast of Pentecost, and leads the neophytes (new Catholics) into a deeper understanding of the sacred mysteries of the Catholic liturgy. The RCIA process leads not only to a change of status with respect to the Church, but also a change of status with respect to God. For those who embark on this journey it is truly life-changing. 



Did You Know? The Archdiocesan Office of Victim Assistance Ministry periodically offers a support program for adult survivors of childhood abuse or neglect: A Faith-Based Response to Adult Survivors of Childhood Abuse and Neglect. This recovery program uses a psycho-educational model. The model is "educational" in that it teaches how the trauma of childhood abuse and neglect typically impacts individuals. It is "psycho-educational" in that it provides tools for participants to safely examine and regulate their feelings, thought patterns and behavior. The entire program is presented in the context of prayer for God's healing and is not a psychotherapy group. The program follows a ten week format and is available in both English and Spanish.
