From Deacon Don's desk:



Recently I heard Fr. Jim include St. Joseph in his Eucharistic Prayer II. I thought that was nice to include St. Joseph since our parish is named after him. It came to light this morning when I found the USCCB statement part of which follows: "On May

1, 2013 the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments promulgated the decree Paternas vices by the authority of the Supreme Pontiff, Pope Francis. The decree instructs that the name of St. Joseph, spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary, should be inserted into Eucharistic Prayers II, III, IV. Already on November 13, 1962, Pope John XXIII had inserted the name of St. Joseph into the first Eucharistic Prayer (The Roman Canon), and now that work has been carried forward to the other three Eucharistic Prayers, initially by Pope Benedict XVI and now confirmed by Pope Francis."

"Pious and liturgical devotion to St. Joseph is first recorded with certainty in the 7th Century, though reference to him is made in Sacred Scripture and multiple patristic texts earlier than that. A full liturgical Office was established for him on March 19, in the 13th century and in 1870 he was proclaimed Patron of the Universal Church.

The decree Paternas vices draws some of its language from this exhortation, expressing in concise words the role of St. Joseph in the economy of salvation, for example, that St. Joseph, 'stands as an exemplary model of kindness and humility....'"

OUR PRAYER: Lord of Justice, enable us to be 'just' and upright after the example of St. Joseph, patron of the Universal Church. Let us be just toward You, toward myself and toward all human beings. We ask this through Your Son Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit one God for ever and ever. Amen

What is RCIA? Every year thousands of adults choose to join the 1.2 billion Catholics in the world. They embark on a journey of conversion through RCIA, the Rite of Christian Initiations of Adults. Started in 1972 by Pope Paul VI, the process has four stages, beginning with a period of Inquiry. This step is the personal reflection of one's life and journey into a life of Catholic Christian Faith. The Catechumenate phase, for those who elect to proceed, concentrates on spiritual formation. It allows them to explore the Church and decide how they can grow as part of the Catholic community. The Election phase, which begins on the first Sunday of Lent, prepares individuals to receive the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion) at the Easter Vigil. The final stage, Mystagogy, continues until the Feast of Pentecost, and leads the neophytes (new Catholics) into a deeper understanding of the sacred mysteries of the Catholic liturgy. This process leads to a change of status with respect to the Church, but also a change of status with respect to God. For those who embark on this journey it is truly life-changing. 

Did You Know? Tips for Summer Camp Safety -


