

From the Pastor's desk:

There is a question that has always nagged believers: Will there be many or few people saved? During certain periods this problem became so acute that it has caused some people terrible anxiety.

This Sunday's Gospel informs us that Jesus himself was once asked this question. "Jesus passed through towns and villages, teaching as he went and making his way to Jerusalem. Someone asked him, 'Lord, will only a few people be saved?'"

The question, as we see, focuses on the number -- How many will be saved? Will it be many or few? In answering the question, Jesus shifts the focus from "how many" to "how" to be saved, that is, by entering "through the narrow gate."

The way, Jesus tells us, is narrow. We have to make the decision to enter through the narrow gate at the beginning, when one starts off on it, but it then becomes a spacious boulevard, because hope, joy and peace of heart are found in it.

YEAR OF FAITH

Year of Faith - In mid-August, we celebrate the Assumption of Mary, Blessed John Paul II's "Star of the New Evangelization." The Preface for the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary extols Mary as the "image of the Church's coming to perfec-

tion." Thankfully, she is also a "sure hope and comfort to your pilgrim people," for August's Gospels certainly challenge pilgrims on our journey of faith. How different from Mary's selfless service is the self-absorption of Luke's "rich fool." Though his fortune is the fruit of honest hard work, the "fool" mistakenly defines himself and his life's worth only in terms of his possessions. But Jesus' disciples should have a different, deeper perspective on life, remembering that one day their Master will suddenly return. Being vigilant for that unknown moment will make us diligent in serving Christ as he comes to us daily in the needs of neighbor and stranger, whom we must treat reverently as fellow servants of God. Bearing witness like this, in Jesus' image, is playing with fire. We may have to experience the burning anguish of choosing what is right rather than what is easy, even to the point of redefining our most personal relationships. This being so, how pointless to wonder, "Who will be saved?" Better to ask, "Will I complete my faith journey faithfully?"

The movement came to the US in 1957, and spread rapidly to every major city/diocese in the country. While everyone experiences something different by the retreat weekend, most participants define the experience as life-changing.

Enable people to live what is fundamental to being a Christian, and to live it together.

Help people discover and fulfill their personal vocations.

Promote the creation of core groups of Christians who leaven their environments with the Gospel.

Restore pride in being a Catholic Christian.

From Deacon Don's desk:



I must confess, once I receive the final blessing and the recessional song is sung, I depart and go about my regular day. Some will stay in Church for a spell. We greet each other then depart. Those that stay for a spell may be internalizing the readings,

even the miracle of the Eucharist, maybe even realize that they have received "blessings" and wish to offer these "blessings" for those in their family, close friends who face troubling times, or offer these blessings of gratitude for others who have touched our hearts. I suggest that our priests need these, your "gifts" received in this Holy Sacrament of the Mass as well. Stop and visit while the Body of Christ is still with you...and .. think of the Gospel proclaimed. I found a quote by Archbishop Oscar Romero (The Voice for the Voiceless) that struck me to the core: "A gospel that doesn't unsettle, a word of God that doesn't get under anyone's skin, a word of God that doesn't touch the real sin of the society in which it is being proclaimed, **what gospel is that**?" Archbishop Romero was killed 3/24/1980 while saying Mass.

Fr. Leonard, SJ said, "Sometimes Jesus uses the metaphor of a blazing fire. Fire sometimes is a necessary good to clear undergrowth that prevents new growth. Maybe this Gospel is to clear away old growth to allow fresh thinking. He quotes, "We've learned to make a living, but not a life; we've added years to life not life to years. We've been to the moon and back but have trouble crossing the street to meet our neighbor. We've cleaned our air but polluted our soul. We have higher incomes but lower morale. What are the essentials of life? As Jesus puts it; 'what is our treasure and where is our heart?' "

OUR PRAYER: Father God, make us realize that the Eucharist is the memorial of Christ's action that freed us of our sins. Help us to participate more devoutly in every Eucharist and obtain the grace to avoid sin. Amen.
