#### From the Pastor's desk:

It is easy to know the meaning of the parable in today's gospel because Luke himself explains it to us right at the very beginning. He clearly tells us that it is a parable on the necessity of praying always and not losing heart.

The important point for us to understand, is that prayer is not so much something we do to bring about an affect on God, or to change God, because God is already and always on our side. Rather, prayer is to bring about an affect on ourselves, to change ourselves, so that we are always on God's side.

May we come to a fuller understanding that the culmination of all prayer is: "Thy will be done, not mine." In other words, in prayer we are seeking what God wants. So our prayer should always be persistent and persevering because in it we are declaring that what God wants is also what we want.

YEAR OF FAITH

Year of Faith - October opens with "Respect Life Sunday," and, in this Year of Faith, Jesus' disciples pray in our name: "Increase our faith." How comforting is Jesus' response. Faith cannot be measured by quantity but by quality—faith's willingness

to trust, risk, dare—and when we see a need, to act on it. Jesus saw ten lepers and healed them; the Samaritan saw that he was healed and gave thanks, faith transforming his healing into salvation. If God sometimes seems slow to act, like the judge in Jesus' story, could God be inviting us, who experience Jesus' self-sacrificing love in the Eucharist, to make God's work of love and justice our own? October's final Sunday prepares us for the Year of Faith's final month with Jesus' parable of the Pharisee and tax-collector. Though everyone presumed the Pharisee to be faith personified, he was not praying to God at all, just talking to himself. He replaced the praise of God with a litany of self-congratulation, and intercession with judging his neighbor. As the Year of Faith draws to a close, Jesus asks each of us, which of these two are you?

#### From Deacon Don's desk:



We are back from visiting our newest grandson and his older brother (now 3yrs old!). A reflection on last week's Gospel started with, "A baby at first becomes fascinated with its fingers and toes. They grow with new discoveries beyond self, through

family, playmates and teachers. They then learn gratitude, trust and sharing that comes through relationships. Jesus receives gratitude from the Samaritan for healing him. Through this he receives salvation. As our relationship with God grows so we know better who we are before God; this deepens our ability to worship and increases our need to give thanks. How do we build relationships with others? By listening attentively, helping without being asked, by affirming the other's goodness, and being honest and trustworthy. Ahh, that's how we build it with God: by listening attentively to God in Scripture and prayer, and being open to and using God's many gifts, especially when He asks of us. All our actions open us to Jesus and He responds, "Your faith has saved you."

In the second reading the hymn says it very well: "If we are unfaithful, He remains faithful, for He cannot deny Himself." Be attentive to God's word in the Gospel.

OUR PRAYER to MARY: Blessed Mother bless our families with your tender Motherly love. May the sacrament of Marriage bring husbands and wives ever closer together that they may always be faithful and love each other as Christ loves us. Help all mothers and fathers love and cherish the children God has entrusted to them. May they be models of a truly Christian life. Amen
