
From Deacon Don's desk:

Last week we closed "Year C" with Luke's Gospel of Christ the King. The Solemnity of Christ the King sums up the Church year by proclaiming Jesus is the central mystery of our **faith**. He told us to keep His presence alive in the world by bringing

Did You Know? Winter months are the peak time for sudden infant death - The number of infants who die from Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) increases in the winter months, according to the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development. Parents often place extra blankets or clothes on infants, hoping to provide them with more warmth. The extra materials may actually increase infants' risk for SIDS. Never let your baby get overheated. Dress your baby in light sleep clothing and keep the room at a temperature that is comfortable for you. Do not bed-share.
