

From the Pastor's desk:

This coming Wednesday is Ash Wednesday and we begin the Season of Lent. Jesus' continuous call to conversion is especially heard during Lent. In our spiritual life, sin can make us think that life away from God and God's

people will be a better life. And yet when we let sin guide our coming and our going, we find ourselves at a place that is not home.

When we're far away from home, our heart aches. And we long to go back where we are always welcomed, supported, and loved. Sin might lead us away from our home in God, yet it can never remove us beyond God's reach and love.

In the same way a father and mother can see into the heart of his or her child, and see the goodness that is there, God sees us in the same way in spite of our sins and faults. During Lent it is important for us to learn that these coming forty days invite us to get on the road that leads us back to our home, a home that leads us to our God.

"When we walk onto the field, we are expected to be perfect, and as the season progresses we are expected to improve!" Ed Runge, MLB umpire. The baseball season is almost upon us **but** more importantly the season of Lent.

How time flies: Three years ago this month we were preparing for the new translation of the Roman Missal. It seemed like a "throw-back" to ages past, but in fact it was to call us to a **greater humility**. We no longer "acknowledge our failures" but "acknowledge our sins." It is **not** indulging in "old-fashioned Catholic guilt." It is aligning us more closely with the original Latin. And more importantly **not to think badly** of ourselves but to think **rightly** about ourselves. It is intended to help us realize how grateful we should be. Though we have sinned and have faults, we have to remember that we have a God of mercy who died for us. That is our gift of salvation. **Everything is a gift** because God is gracious and merciful. The intent is to put us into a "**right relationship** with God." He is our Creator and we owe Him adoration.

OUR PRAYER: God of goodness, help us to remember that our greatest friend is Jesus, Your Son. Let our relationship with Him support and encourage a right relationship with all our friends and keep us faithful to one another. Amen





Did You Know? A good photo could save a child's

life - One of the most important tools for law enforcement to use in the case of a missing child is an updated (every six months), good school-portrait quality, head-and-shoulders color photograph of the child in which the face is clearly seen. The background should be plain or solid so it does not distract from the subject. When possible, the photograph should be in a digitized form, and available on a compact disk (CD), as opposed to just a hard copy. This minimizes the time necessary to scan, resize, and make color corrections before disseminating it to law enforcement. The photograph should have space for accurate, narrative description useful to identify the child such as name, nickname, height, weight, sex, age, eye color, identifying marks, glasses, and braces.
