In John's gospel this weekend, Martha makes the great profession of faith that Peter makes in the other three gospels. "You are the Messiah, the Son of God."

Sometimes we can feel about the Lord just like Martha did when Jesus took so long to arrive in Bethany when Lazarus was sick. Thanks for coming Lord, but you're a little late. I know you're with me Lord, but where were you when I needed you?

But Jesus reassures us as he reassured Martha. "Look, no matter when I seem to get there, I've been with you all the time, and I can pull life out of anything. I can do that with your sins. I can do that with your tragedies. I can restore you to life."

This is the lesson of Lazarus' rising. Believing that Jesus brought Lazarus back to life makes all the difference to us. Why? Because we haven't lost hope. We can always put our faith in the Lord. We can respond to those situations in our life that aren't good and know that Jesus can pull life out of it. It is a powerful belief. So, as we approach Easter, let's embrace the spirit of this Gospel and truly live this belief.

Reflecting on the journey of our Confirmandi reminded me of a homily I heard last month on the word **commitment**. What are the symbols of commitment?

A signature is one: John Hancock and the Continental Congress put their names on the Declaration of Independence. Native Americans showed commitment to a treaty by "passing the peace pipe." Another is raising our right hand or placing it over our heart when we "Pledge Allegiance." The founding fathers mutually pledged to each other "their lives, fortunes and sacred honor."

St. Paul said, "I am convinced that neither death, nor life nor angels nor principalities, present things, nor future things, nor height, depth nor any creature can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." Romans 3:34-39 And in a few weeks you will see Jesus confront Peter and ask him three times, "Peter, do you love Me?" You know his response **but** do you remember what Jesus replied? "Tend and feed my sheep." Jn 21:16-17 This is our commitment, to serve those in need.

OUR PRAYER: Heavenly Father, may You choose this time to open wide the windows of heaven and pour out Your greatest blessings upon the Confirmation candidates and their families who long to be at the table with You and share in the banquet of life. We ask this through Jesus Christ, Your Son who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever. Amen
