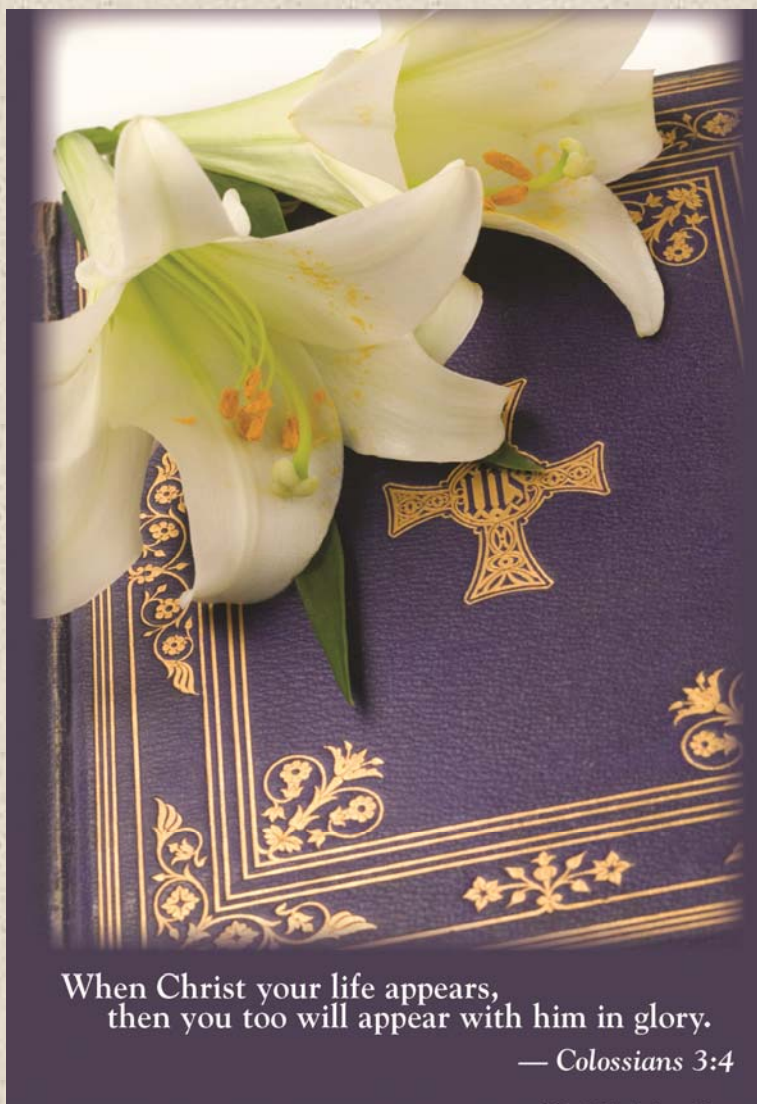

Holy Thursday is the **birthday** of the **Mass**. The words of Consecration tell us that "at the time He was betrayed and entered willingly into His Passion, He took bread and giving thanks broke it and gave it to His disciples. **Take this** all of you **and eat of it for this is my body** which will be given up for you." Pope Francis visited a prison for minors last year. Using the Lord's example of washing the disciples' feet he said: "It is the Lord's example: He is the most important, and He washes feet, because with us what is the highest must be at the service of others. This is a symbol, it is a sign. Washing feet means: 'I am at your service. But what does this mean? That all of us must help one another. Sometimes I am angry with someone or other, but let it go, and if he or she asks you a favor, do it. As a priest and a bishop, I must be at your service.'" Fr. Rolheiser wrote that Simon of Cyrene was forced to carry the cross because Jesus was too weak and wearied. Was he at the wrong place at the wrong time? It may have been an irritation and even a humbling and shameful experience carrying the cross of a convicted criminal in front of a jeering crowd. It's not exactly like helping Arnold Palmer carry his golf clubs! Jesus' cross comes in many forms: Are you one with a gentle nature and can't say no when someone takes advantage of you? Are you Simon who helps Jesus carry the cross? "Though He was in the form of God, Jesus did not deem equality with God something to be grasped at....He was known to be of human estate...thus He humbled Himself, obediently accepting even **death on a cross!** ...So that at Jesus' name every knee must bend, in heaven, on earth and under the earth and every tongue to the glory of God, **Jesus Christ is Lord!** Phil 2:6-11 (condensed)

The resurrection is the central fact of human history, granted death is inevitable, Our Lord has shown that humanity can conquer it. Since it commemorates the most glorious even known to man, **EASTER** is naturally the climax of the Church's liturgical cycle. Everything hinges on it. Our Lord's rising from the dead is at the same time His greatest victory and the invincible proof that He is God. As such, it is the foundation of our faith. Truly, Easter is the solemnity of solemnities.

**OUR PRAYER:** Father God, today is the day of **Easter joy**. It is the day when the Lord appeared to us who had all but given up hope but opened our eyes to what scripture predicted: "first He must die then rise and ascend into His Father's glorious presence." May our minds and eyes be opened to know Him in the breaking of the Bread. May Easter's blessings be yours in abundance. Amen

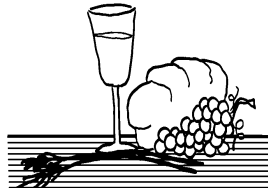
