From the Pastor's desk:

The readings today show me that there are two things within us that are mysterious and can't truly be known unless they are outwardly expressed. One is love and the other is the Holy Spirit. I'd like to concentrate on the Holy

Spirit because that is where our love emanates from. The Holy Spirit, the Person of the Holy Trinity who is Love personified, acts within each one of us. The Holy Spirit is present within our hearts and souls, living and inspiring us. We can never see the Holy Spirit as separate and apart standing alone.

The Holy Spirit is the love between the Father and the Son that is shared with each of us. The Holy Spirit lives and breathes within our souls. We see the Holy Spirit in our actions and in the actions of others.

Scripture gives several different names to the Holy Spirit, identifying Him as the Consoler, the Advocate, the Sanctifier, and the Paraclete. His consolations strengthen us when we feel weak, inadequate, and powerless.

The word "Paraclete" in Greek translates into English as "to be beside one". The Holy Spirit stands beside us; He is our Advocate, our Counselor, and our Guide. The Holy Spirit, which our creed tells us is the Lord and giver of Life, animates us, that is to say He gives us a sharing in God's life.

He is beside us to defend us. We need our Advocate, our Consoler, our Paraclete, the "one called to be beside us" when we face doubt and discouragement.

As we approach the Ascension of our Lord next weekend and the great Solemnity of Pentecost the week after, my hope is that we look to God with faith knowing that His great gift to us, the sending of His Holy Spirit into us, allows us to bring God's great love into the world by what we say and what we do.

From Deacon Don's desk:

This I have come to call my "reality check." It is from Paul's letter to the Romans 14:7-9:

"None of us lives as his own master and none of us dies as his own master. While we live, we are responsible to the Lord, and when we die we die as His servants. Both in life and in death we are the Lord's. That is why Christ died and came to life again, that He might be Lord of both the living and the dead."

I suggest that you pick up a copy of the bulletin of May 18. Fr. Jim's homily, which was principally addressed to our First Communion children last Sunday, speaks to us as well. The Pastor's message: Jesus is the **way**, the **truth** and the **life**. It is for all of us to meditate on John 14:1-12.

The New Evangelization is like "paying it forward." Tony Gwynn and Wade Boggs won 13 batting titles between them, and they gave credit to Ted Williams who loved to teach hitting and could sit for hours with young players. We don't have to be experts to model Christ in our daily lives. We need to "let go and let God."

Just be faithful, "plant seeds" and pray. Your good example is the way to start. It's been said that you can count the seeds in an apple, but only God can count the apples in a seed

Our Prayer: Father, may we whom You renew in baptism bear witness to our faith by the way we live. By the suffering, death, and resurrection of Your Son may we come to eternal joy. We ask this in Your Son's name who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever. Amen

Human Trafficking Crisis in Long Beach

You are invited to participate in a campaign of mercy. We are gathering items to be distributed to rescued victims of human trafficking. Humanitarian bags will help to restore dignity and hope to these child victims who come in with only the clothes on their backs. We ask that the items be new. Sample size toiletries are best (no hotel labels, they could trigger horrid memories). Bottle water, snacks, flip flops, socks, t-shirts, sweat pants, lap blankets, stuffed animals, inspirational books, a letter or card of hope and solidarity. These may be dropped at the rectory office.

Facts about human trafficking: globally, the average cost of a slave is \$90. There are approximately 30 million slaves worldwide. According to the U.S. State Dept., 600,000 - 800,000 people are trafficked across international borders annually. More than 70% are female and half are children.




