Today we celebrate the Most Holy Body and Blood Of Christ (Corpus Christi). The cup we share, is it not the blood of Christ? And the bread we break, is it not His body? This Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord is a reminder of the

awesome gift that is the **Eucharist**. It needs and requires our respect and devotion. When we are about to receive this sacred Communion it is time for us to reflect and focus on what we are about to do. Just before receiving Communion we bow. We reinforce our faith by this bow and again when we extend our hand and say Amen. The disciples said, "This teaching is too difficult. People are leaving us." Jesus said, "And are you going too?" Peter makes his statement of faith, "Where are we to go, Lord? You have the words of eternal life." Congratulations to our new First Communion class.

This solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord reminds us of who we are and Who is present in the tabernacles of our churches throughout the world.

We must understand that our Catholic faith makes this Eu**charist** and awesome gift. The Collect, or opening prayer, says "O God, who in this wonderful Sacrament have left us a memorial of Your Passion, grant us, we pray, so to revere the sacred mysteries of Your Body and Blood that we may always experience in ourselves the fruits of Your redemption."

OUR PRAYER: Heavenly Father, help us to feel at one with all Christians throughout the world. Let Your Holy Spirit pour forth Your grace into the hearts of all Christians and bring them into closer unity in the one **Body of Christ**. Amen

Facts about human trafficking: globally, the average cost of a slave is \$90. According to the U.S. State Dept., 600,000 - 800,000 people are trafficked across international borders annually.

More than 70% are female and half are children.


