From the Pastor's desk:

We are always interested in knowing what others think about us. Our children, even if they don't say it, care a lot about what we think of them, since it is precisely what will form their identity.

If we respond to them with words that make them feel that they are useless or inept, they will grow up to be useless and inept. We sometimes do this unconsciously by not trusting their ability to do something, or humiliating them over something they have done or ignoring their dreams. On the positive side we can also communicate a very different image to our children through respect, honesty, trust and support.

Peter and Paul meet Jesus at different times. When Jesus meets Peter his name is Simon, and when Jesus meets Paul his name is Saul, and it is then that the Lord changes their names and tells them who they are in reality.

Jesus didn't blame them because of their human weakness, instead he entrusted them with his church and mission. In being recognized by Christ they found their true identity. As faithful Christians we can have confidence in the ability of Jesus to show us our true identity, so that we may take up the mission that He entrusts to each one of us.
