# From the Pastor's desk:



This encouraging story reassures people that whatever rejection they and the Church face, their ministry will always be far more fruitful than we can imagine or even see at the time.

# From Deacon Don's desk:

Speaking of **humility**: on April 15, 1947, like many New Yorkers, this man dressed up and headed for the subway. To his wife he said: "Just in case you have trouble picking me out, I'll be wearing number 42." No one had trouble picking out

the black man who you know as Jackie Robinson in the Dodgers uniform when he trotted out to play first base at Ebbets field. The majors had 16 teams, each with a 25 man roster. That day there were 399 not 400 major league players who were white. That's why #42 is the only number permanently retired by every major league team.

Early in his preaching career Billy Graham came to a small town. Wanting to mail a letter, he asked a young boy where the post office was. When the boy told him, Dr. Graham thanked him and said, "If you'll come to the Baptist church this evening, you can hear me telling everyone how to get to heaven." The boy said, "I don't think I'll be there. You don't even know your way to the post office!"

"Pride wants to be king, humility desires to be servant....don't think of humility as to degrade us but its purpose is to raise us." Fr. Henri Lacordiare (1861)

It's humility that opens us to be of service to others. "What you can do I cannot do, what I can do you cannot do. But together we'll do something beautiful for God." Blessed Teresa of Calcutta.

My challenge is for all of us at Mass to focus on the Confiteor (Latin for I confess - the penitential act). Here is the humble part: the striking of the breast. I'm guilty: I do a perfunctory (routine - without interest) striking of the breast. I don't what you to hurt yourself but to show God you are sincere in your asking for a cleansing as we go deeper into the Mass.

OUR PRAYER: Most loving Father, grant that every **Eucharistic** cerebration may unite us more closely to Your Divine Son. May it also unite us to our Christian brothers and sisters and help us grow in greater love for them, especially the poor and lonely. Amen.
